# **INFORMATION REPORT**

# ORIGIN

Initiated by the African Descent Advisory Committee through the Legislative Assistant.

# BACKGROUND

On May 9, 2023, Halifax Regional Council approved Administrative Order 2021-004-GOV *Respecting the African Descent Advisory Committee in the Halifax Regional Municipality* to establish the African Descent Advisory Committee. The African Descent Advisory Committee reports to the Executive Standing Committee and advises the Municipality on the impact of municipal policies, programs and services for People of African Descent.

## DISCUSSION

The African Decent Advisory Committee met 10 times between September 11, 2023 and November 20, 2024 virtually over zoom and in-person at the HEMDCC Meeting Space.

The African Descent Advisory Committee's business for the period covering September 11, 2023 and November 20, 2024 includes the following:

- 2 external presentations from members of the public
- 9 Committee led discussions
- 3 staff presentations
- 9 staff updates
- 2 staff reports
- 2 motions passed

The work of the African Descent Advisory Committee within the first year was devoted to formulating and concluding their Work Plan. The African Descent Advisory Committee approved their 2024/25 Work Plan on April 10, 2025. The 2024/25 Work Plan was subsequently approved by the Executive Standing Committee on April 28, 2025. The African Descent Advisory Committee identified their 4 core values, 7 areas of commitment and 3 actionable priorities.

The Committee passed the below recommendation to Executive Standing Committee:

#### Africville

Motion approved that the African Descent Advisory Committee recommends that Executive Standing Committee direct the Chief Administrative Officer to research, beginning with the Campbell Road, using available municipal resources and other information provided to the Municipality, to understand the history of Africville up to February 24, 2010, the apology date.

#### African Nova Scotian Representation in the Halifax Regional Police

Motion approved that the African Descent Advisory Committee recommends that Executive Standing Committee direct the Chief Administrative Officer to request a staff report on:

- 1. The representation of people of African Nova Scotian descent in the Halifax Regional Police force;
- 2. The status of the all-African descent cadet class of 1993;
- 3. An understanding of education provided to all officers around systemic racism and all matters; and
- 4. That the staff report be provided to the African Nova Scotian Descent Advisory Committee for review and possible recommendation.

Additionally, the Committee has a standing agenda item to receive staff updates on the work of the African Nova Scotian Affairs Integration Office at each meeting and a standing information report titled Memorandum from the Legislative Assistant re: Requests to Present to the African Descent Advisory Committee.

The activities of the African Descent Advisory Committee are guided by the Administrative Order 2021-004-GOV *Respecting the African Descent Advisory Committee in the Halifax Regional Municipality*, and by the approved African Descent Advisory Committee 2024/25 Work Plan.
