






Taekwondo Canada Nationals

Canada'spremier domestic competition, bringing together elite athletes to compete in both Kyorugi (Sparring) and Poomsae (Forms) for national titles and Team Canada selection across ages and divisions. The event includes divisions from Youth as young as 8, to Masters in their 70s (so far!)

The event attracts 500-800 competitors annually across all categories. Athletes qualify through provincial championships and sanctioned tournaments, meeting specific point thresholds (Kyorugi) or technical requirements (Poomsae) set by their provincial associations.

Associations


Drives provincial programs in both disciplines, strengthens inter provincial relationships, and standardizes development


2nd day of competition features kyorugi or sparring for our Cadet and Junior athletes The final day of competition features our Senior athletes competing for positions on the National team for 2026-27


Skylar Park Olympic Bronze Medalist

Economic Impact

How the event benefits Halifax and local businesses

The 2026 Taekwondo Canada National Championships will provide a significant economic impact to Halifax through the booking of multiple hotels to be used by athletes/coaches/parents/officials and staff related to the event.

As mentioned earlier, we expect over 750 athletes and 1,700 spectators for the event. For many, it is a costly family trip, and they make the most of it. Enjoying local amenities, restaurants, and tourism attractions. This is a significant boon for Halifax in February, where things tend to be slower in the downtown core.

Sutton Place was chosen as the partner for our staff and referee rooming with 50 rooms being used for the duration of the event.

We are in discussions with Marriot, Delta Halifax and other to secure roon blocks for hundreds more rooms.

Local Sport Promotion

For Taekwondo Nova Scotia, hosting the event will help us promote the sport regionally, and bring more athletes into our sport. Taekwondo has a low financial barrier when compared to other popular sports. It will also allow us to bring more of our regional talent to the event. for some families far flung travel is out of the question, and this will be the opportunity of a lifetime for some athletes.
