Halifax Regional Police/ RCMP Halifax Regional Detachment Semi-Annual Crime and Traffic Statistics - January to June 2025

Background

 The information in this presentation covers a six-month period of incidents which occurred in Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM) between January 1, 2025, and June 30, 2025, and offers a comparison with the same period in 2024


- This is the first joint semi-annual crime and traffic statistics report prepared by HRP and RCMP HRD
- The next semi-annual crime and traffic statistics report will cover the period of July 1, 2025, to December 31, 2025

Calls for Service

- <u>Public-generated calls for service</u> include calls to police from members of the public, business organizations, partner agencies etc.
- <u>Proactive calls for service</u> include foot patrols, traffic stops, and proactive assignments e.g., checking on an individual subject to bail conditions, or high visibility patrol in an area recently subject to high levels of crime
- Online reports include certain non-emergency crimes or incidents which are reported through the online reporting form

Calls for Service - HRM


- Total calls for service: 126,747
- Public-generated calls: 89,905
- Proactive calls: 33,178
- Online reports: 3,664
- Overall, a 7% total increase when compared with the same period in 2024 (118,837)



■ Public-generated calls ■ Proactive calls ■ Online reports


Calls for Service - HRP

- Total calls for service: 77,279
- Public-generated calls: 58,674
- Proactive calls: 15,500
- Online reports: 3,105
- Overall, a 9.1% increase when compared with the same period in 2024
- There was a 20% increase in the number of proactive calls, specifically foot patrols and proactive assignments. It is believed the Alternative Response Unit pilot and increased foot patrols for the purpose of enhanced community engagement, are contributing factors to the increase in proactive activity



Calls for Service – RCMP HRD

- Total calls for service: 49,331
- Public-generated calls: 31,231
- Proactive calls: 17,678
- Online reports: 422
- Overall, a 2.9% increase when compared with the same period in 2024
- There was a 5% increase in the number of proactive calls
- The enhanced use of Operation Breach and increased use of electronic monitoring are believed to be contributing factors to the rise in proactive activity

Crime Types

- <u>Crimes Against Persons</u> refers to a crime where a person is the primary target (e.g., homicide, attempted homicide, assault, sexual violations or robbery)
- <u>Crimes Against Property</u> refers to a crime where the primary target is property (e.g., break and enter, fraud, theft, or shoplifting)
- Other Criminal Code (OCC) matters refer to other crime types such as drug offences, criminal traffic violations, offensive weapons or bail violations

- Top offences include sexual assault and distribution of images
- Majority of incidents took place in Central Division

Crimes Against Property - HRP

SHOPLIFTING & STOLEN GOODS

\$HOPLIFTING 22,709 in 2

- 602 additional incidents reported in HRP jurisdiction
- In the Dartmouth area, the increase in shoplifting has been primarily dominated by thefts from grocery and liquor stores



- Two additional incidents reported
- Officers focused efforts on proactive activity in central Halifax to target hubs selling stolen goods

- 54 additional incidents reported in RCMP HRD jurisdiction
- RCMP HRD has increased focus on patrols in areas of high shoplifting occurrences which may be a factor impacting the decrease in shoplifting

- Although theft from motor vehicles in RCMP HRD jurisdiction is generally decreasing, there has been an increase in the areas of Tantallon and Cole Harbour
- This has resulted in additional patrols and targeted investigations


Other Criminal Code (OCC) - HRM

- There were 178 more incidents across the municipality when compared with the same period in 2024



- Within HRP areas, arson increased by seven incidents or 70% when compared with the same period the previous year
- These files have been reviewed for trends or links, but none have been identified at this time
- Eight of the incidents occurred in East Division, six occurred in West Division, and three occurred in Central Division

Other Criminal Code (OCC) – RCMP HRD

CRIME TYPES



- Operation Breach is a process used by both policing agencies to check offenders within our community who are on court-imposed curfew conditions
- The enhanced use of Operation Breach to identify bail violations and the increased use of electronic monitoring are believed to be contributing factors to the rise in reports of bail violations

Shooting Incidents - HRM

Shooting Incidents	HRP	RCMP HRD
January - June 2024	9	5
January -June 2025	11	7

- Between January 1, 2025, and June 30, 2025, there were 19 shooting incidents
- This represents a 36% increase when compared with the same period in 2024
- 11 incidents occurred within HRP jurisdiction, seven within RCMP HRD jurisdiction, and the location of one incident remains under investigation


Firearm-related Homicides

Firearm-related Homicides	HRP	RCMP HRD
January - June 2024	0	3

- There were four firearm-related homicides between January 1, 2025, and June 30, 2025
- This represents an increase of 33% when compared with the first six months of 2024
- All the firearm-related homicides so far this year have occurred within HRP jurisdiction


Firearm Seizures

- Between January 1, 2025, and June 30, 2025, there were a total of 464 firearms seized
- 219 firearms were seized in HRP jurisdiction, and 245 firearms were seized in RCMP HRD jurisdiction
- This represents an increase of 24% when compared with the same period in 2024



Crime Distribution by Policing District




