Subject: Active Transportation Update

Parkland Drive AT – The draft Functional Plan was presented to the internal technical committee today for review. The consultant will integrate the feedback received today into the Functional Plan Report.

Bayers Road AT Connection – Starting a structural analysis of the Bayers Road bridge to determine if the proposed addition of a multi-use pathway and barrier of the bridge will be feasible.

Almon St. (Agricola to Gottingen) - Existing Conditions Memo is complete and the first technical committee was hosted this week to review a pre-screening of concepts before identifying those that will be further developed. Public engagement (including a presentation to ATAC) is planned for late Fall.

Isleville Intersections – We'll be taking an application to upgrade the existing vehicle diverters at Young/Kaye/Isleville streets and Isleville/Almon streets for review. The target for construction has been pushed to 2027.

Community Grants for Capital and Re-Capitalization projects – Applications are accepted until October 6th. Details related to applicants and project eligibility, terms and conditions and application package are available at www.halifax.ca/grants - choose Active Transportation Grants link.

Hail Pond Park/ Dunbrack Street: We'll be conducting an in-person project update and information session for area residents and external stakeholder groups in October.

Eco-Counters – Dutch Village Rd and Brunswick St bikeway counters are in the hands of inspectors/contractors for installation. We fixed the Macdonald Bridge Bikeway counter's loops. Still working out the details of procuring counters with NSPW for Aerotech Connector MUP. We helped Dal install a new battery pack for the University Ave counter display and asked them about including their data in HRM's dashboard.
