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

Controller Harris requested that the City Engineer report on the condition of the asphalt sidewalk on the east side of Hollis Street between Bishop and 149

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

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

RESOLVED that the Council of the Civic Improvement League express to the Board of Control its recognition of the fact that while bill boards are an offence in many positions there are some in which they may reasonably be erected and maintained, but that it is the feeling of this Council that wherever there is reasonable protest on aesthetic or other grounds against a bill board in a given position a refusal to grant a permit for erection in such a position is justifiable.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of this League express its conviction that there is a large volume of sentiment against bill boards and that the unexpressed statement is likely to be much greater than the expressed.

Rev. Robert Johnson, Park Street Presbyterian Church, protested against two boards in the vicinity of the Church.

Ex-Alderman Constant Upham objects to bill boards at the corner of Campbell Road and Hanover Street, and on Campbell Road, north of Hanover Street.

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Ex-Alderman A. A. Thomson desires that if a permit is granted for a bill board at the corner of Agricola and Cunard Streets, that the board should be set back from the street line at least five feet.

E. A. Saunders, representing the Willow Park petitioners, objected to the granting of permits for so many bill boards at Willow Park.

Charles Bell objected to bill boards on Albemarle Street.

Alderman Parker objected to bill boards on Windsor Street, Almon Street and Campbell Road.

Emanuel Jensen objected to bill boards, Willow Park.

At Toronto they had been informed that they would

receive ample pay to maintain themselves and to maintain the families of the married men. The actual rate of pay was not told them . When they presented themselves on board the H.M.C.S. Miebe to sign on they were told that the rate of pay would be only 70 cents per day, and that they refused to sign for so small a wage. They are now in Halifax altogether without means.

His Worship the Mayor informed the delegation that he had last evening telegraphed to the Honorable Minister of Marine and Fisheries in respect to this matter and was awaiting a reply. Pending information from Ottawa the Chief of Police is instructed to see that all of these men are cared for.
