- 10.1.1 Presentation from John Simmons, Supervisor Urban Forester re: The Importance of Trees in Urban Planning

The following was before the Advisory Committee:

• A staff presentation dated March 27, 2017

Mr. John Simmons, Supervisor Urban Forester, provided the staff presentation regarding the Urban Forest Master Plan. Mr. Simmons responded to questions from the Committee throughout the presentation, which highlighted:

- Canada's increasingly urban population and the growing interest in the importance of urban forests
- The public benefits of urban trees, including:
 - Pollution reduction and carbon capture
 - Rain interruption and absorption
 - Mitigation of urban heat islands and shade for human comfort
 - Extending the life of roads and urban infrastructure via the interruption of sunlight
 - Traffic calming and increased property values
 - Water filtration and shore erosion mitigation for urban lakes and rivers

- Unquantifiable benefits like aesthetics, wildlife habitat preservation, and the screening of UV light, etc.
- Overall crime reduction
- The problems faced by trees and forests in urban environments, including:
 - Pollutants and pests
 - New planting that sometimes does not keep up with natural loss
 - Intense human activity
 - Vandalism
- Future opportunities for managing the urban canopy, including cyclical tree trimming

Ms. Miller asked about the Municipalities plans for planting trees in areas that are currently sparsely planted, like Mulgrave Park and the Bayers Road area. Mr. Simmons noted there are planting opportunities in those areas and that he is working to advance canopy cover in those communities. Mr. Simmons also noted that one difficulty with planting, particularly in the Mulgrave Park and Creighton Street areas is the limited front yards and tight density.

Various Committee members asked about the mix of native species currently being planted by the Municipality, and what powers the Municipality has to maintain trees on private property. Mr. Simmons noted that the mix of plantings and their timings, particularly on new subdivision developments across the Municipality, may need to be revisited to encourage planting and retention that measures metrics nearer to the end of the development process.

The Chair thanked Mr. Simmons for providing this information.

Councillor Mason left the meeting at 4:55 p.m.
