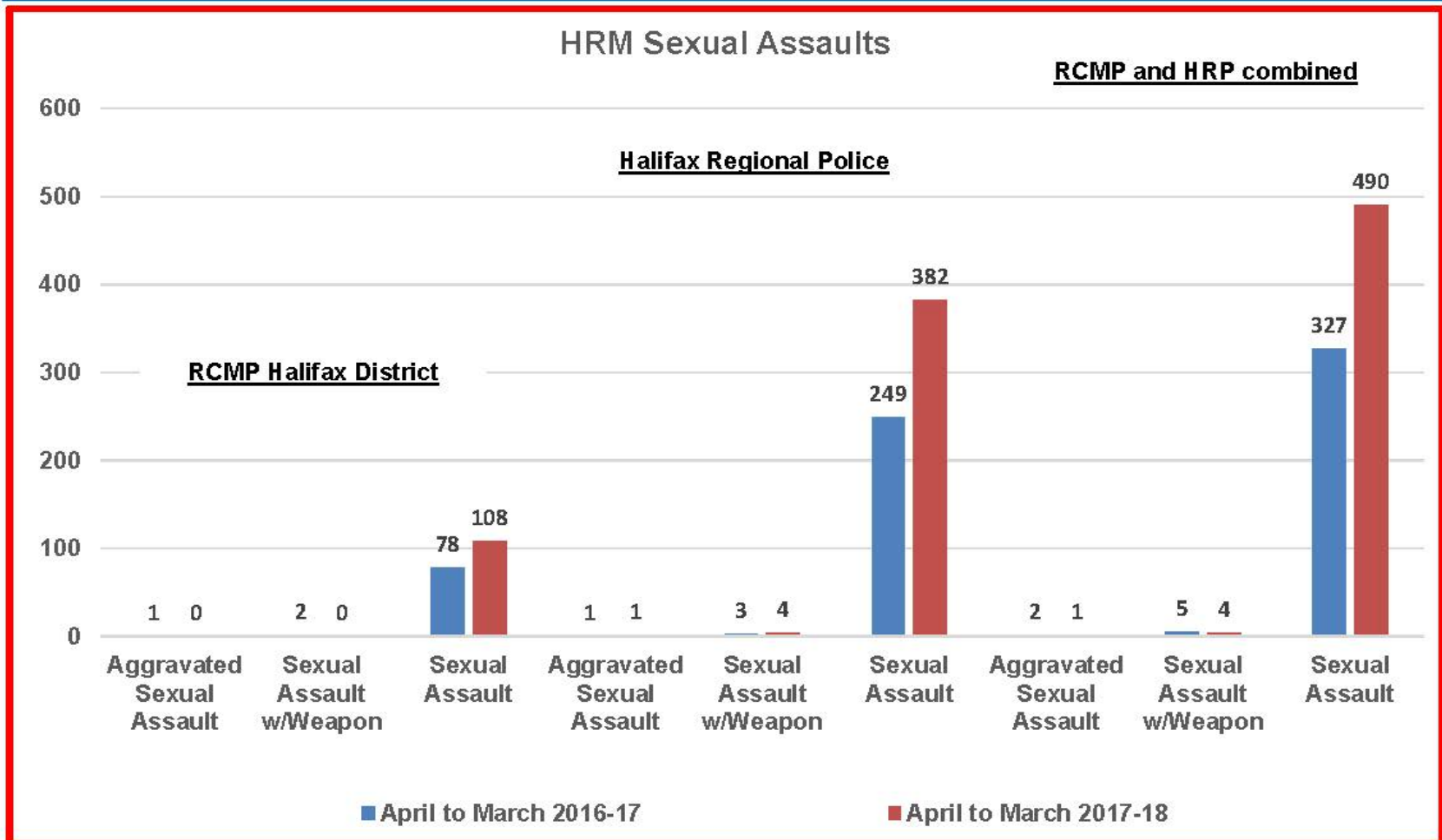




April - March
