7.3.1 Overview of ISANS Programs & Our Work with Women – Jennifer Watts, CEO of Immigrant Services Association of Nova Scotia (ISANS)

Jennifer Watts, CEO of ISANS provided an overview of the Organization's vision, mission, strategic plan, past/ongoing activities and initiatives, and impact of COVID-19 on immigrant women. Watts explained that affordability of internet service, digital literacy, and access to internet service, which all lead women to miss social and economic opportunities in the community, are examples of impacts of COVID-19 on immigrant women.

- National & partnership project for LGBTQIA2S+

- Service distribution across region
- Gender based violence and trauma
- Women and employment

9.1.1 Update on GBA+ from Office of Diversity and Inclusion

Caroline Hemstock, Diversity and Inclusion Advisor provided an update on staff's work on Gender Based Analysis Plus.

- 1) GBA+ knowledge sharing with Halifax Regional Municipality employees
 - Office of Diversity and Inclusion/ANSAIO provided an overview of GBA+ to leadership team of the Corporate and Customer Service business unit in March.
 - Office of Diversity and Inclusion will provide a presentation and overview of GBA+ to the Planning and Development business unit in April.
 - Office of Diversity and Inclusion is currently working on development of tool kit for GBA+ in collaboration with the Communications team. This tool kit will launch in the next few months.
- 2) Project Women's Quality of Life Report Card
 - To help understand women's quality of life in the Halifax region and possibly inform municipal policies, services and programs the Office of Diversity and Inclusion/ANSIAO is working with a research partner to apply an intersectional lens to quantitative data on their experiences. Preliminary results will be available in spring or summer, 2021.
