## MEMORANDUM

**SUBJECT:** **PPP Operations Update**

### Update on projects:

- Most of the deteriorated stone wall was removed from the perimeter of the Tower Rd parking lot and replaced with wooden posts and cable.
- Drainage repairs (new culvert installations) at the bottom of Tower hill and Ogilvie rd.
- Signage – New style off leash rules, pick up after your pets and bike etiquette signage installed. Others are still in the works for printing.
- Stone wall repair starting at the entrance to Birch Rd. at the Point Pleasant Drive entrance.

### Forestry Management Plan:

- Phase 3 thinning on hold this year, plan to complete in the fall of 2022.

### Winter operations:

5 staff are exempt from the TPW winter works program to focus on parks west winter maintenance. The plowing and maintenance of PPP is top priority with approximately 30 other sites also being maintained.

Sanding for ice control is the task that takes up the most time vs. actual plowing. With the constant freeze/thaw cycle often the park must be sanded several times on repetitive days as it melts during the day and re-freezes overnight. We often can't plow to bare gravel as this causes extensive damage to the road surface. Only main graveled roads are maintained, not the smaller footpaths.

# HRM PARKS SNOW & ICE REMOVAL

To promote healthy and livable communities it is necessary to keep parks and their facilities accessible during the winter. The safety of park visitors and staff is top priority. Point Pleasant and Shubie parks are the only 2 regional parks that receive full servicing during the winter months, along with Fairview, Camp Hill, Mount Herman and St. Peters cemeteries. In addition, approximately 48 parking lots (27 in West and 21 in East) are plowed. A combination of plow trucks and utility vehicles equipped with spreaders and snow blowers are the typical equipment used. After snow clearing has been completed, crusher dust (fine gravel) is typically spread on non-paved parking lots, roadways and trails, while salt is used on paved parking lots to reduce slip hazards.

## GUIDELINES

- These guidelines are in effect from November 15 to April 15.
- The requirement for snow removal activities may not be needed for events giving 5 cm or less of accumulation.
- The ability to meet these guidelines is not expected when a snow event delivers 25 cm or more of accumulation.
- The snow event stop time will be determined by the Superintendent of winter operations and posted to the Halifax.ca website. This time will be used as the baseline to achieve these parks guidelines as well as the Transportation and Public Works service standards.
- The clock shall be reset and guideline expectations start over again when an additional 5 cm or more of snow has fallen or been blown in by strong winds after the snow event stop time.
- The push back or removal of site line obstructions caused by snow clearing activities will be done as resources and time allows.
- In the event of multiple machinery breakdowns all efforts will be put in place to meet the above guidelines however they may only be achievable once resources and time allows.
- Plowing operations do not occur during extreme weather conditions (blizzards, ice storms) or at night.
