# SPEED LIMIT REDUCTION - ST. MARGARETS BAY ROAD

The Halifax Regional Municipality has advised that the speed limit has been reduced from 70 km/h to 60 km/h on a segment of St. Margarets Bay Road in Head of St. Margarets Bay. The reduced speed zone will be an extension of an existing 60 km/h zone, which will now continue from the previous limit at civic 5507 to Mason Point Road.

New signage has been posted.

This change is a result of an assessment of the corridor, related to changes in conditions and activities along the roadway.

This effort supports the municipal <u>Strategic</u>
<u>Road Safety Plan</u>, which aims to reduce fatal and injury collisions on municipal roadways.

#### PARKING PERMIT FEE INCREASE

On Saturday, April 1<sup>st</sup>, changes to annual parking permit fees, visitor parking permits, commuter permits, carshare parking and the ability to purchase second permits were put into effect.

- Annual parking permit fees will increase from \$40/year to \$75/year.
- Residents can purchase a second annual parking permit for \$175/year.
- Annual visitor parking permits will shift to pay-per-use:

One day: \$15Two days: \$25Seven days: \$35

- Carshare vehicles will be able to park at any on-street paid parking location.
- Commuter permits will see price increases or price decreases, depending on the zone.
- Student commuter permits will change from a flat rate of \$35/month to \$10/month discount off the regular zone price.
- All permits will shift to a digital format, removing the need for replacement fees.

These changes, supported by amendments to <a href="By-law P-1200">By-law P-1200</a> and approved by Regional Council, will streamline purchases, increase flexibility and create efficiencies in a new digital format. These changes are also based on resident feedback and will better align with residents' needs and better reflect the cost of administering these programs.

### **ELECTRIC BUS DEMONSTRATION**



Most of Halifax Council and some Halifax
Transit staff rode a demo version of the
proposed new electric (EV) buses from Nova
Bus. HRM has ordered 60 EV buses and the first
30 should arrive in September.

There are MANY benefits - environmentally, financially, and socially – to having EV buses. They are quieter and will give pedestrians and patio patrons a much better auditory

experience as they cruise down our main streets.

EV buses also require less maintenance and are cheaper to operate. They charge in 5 hours or less and can run from ~350kms in the winter to ~500kms in the summer (good for about 80% of our current bus routes).

**FOOD INSECURITY** 



What is HRM doing about <u>food insecurity</u>? On March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2023, Regional Council approved <u>Part A of the JustFOOD Action</u>
<u>Plan</u> for the Halifax Region, the first food strategy for the municipality. Click <u>report</u> to view the full staff report as presented to Regional Council.

The Action Plan is a long-range strategy to guide actions to improve food security and strengthen our local food system, with clear roles for all and the resources needed for positive change. The municipality and the Halifax Food Policy Alliance (HFPA) are coleading the development of the action plan, recognizing that we need to work together towards a healthy, just and sustainable food system. relationship with HFPA and kicked off the JustFOOD Action Plan. A complete plan, Part A and Part B, will be brought to Halifax Regional Council for approval in the Fall of 2023.

## JUNO AWARDS - MARCH 2024



The Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS) announced that The JUNO Awards are returning to Atlantic Canada, making their second visit to Halifax (Kjipuktuk) in **March 2024**. Halifax will host a revered lineup of JUNO Week events from March 21<sup>st</sup> – 24<sup>th</sup>, 2024. The 53rd Annual JUNO Awards will broadcast live on CBC from Scotiabank Centre on Sunday, March 24<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

The JUNO Awards are being held in Nova Scotia's capital for the first time since 2006. # **CN RAIL BRIDGE – JUBILEE ROAD**



<u>CN</u> and HRM are coordinating the rehabilitation of the <u>CN</u> Rail

Bridge on Jubilee Road. The work was anticipated to begin in July 2022 but has been delayed until spring 2023 to allow additional time for technical considerations. There are no immediate structural concerns with the existing bridge impacted by the delay to the project.

The upcoming work will include the rehabilitation of the arch bridge structure, full replacement of the paved surface, railing, and sidewalks, at each location.

The construction tender for the project is expected to be awarded by <u>CN</u> in early 2023.

In late March 2022, preliminary site preparation, including tree removal, was completed by CN. Every effort was made to ensure removal of only those trees required to accommodate repairs to the bridge.

#### **ROAD REPAIRS & TRAFFIC CALMING**

A review of Roosevelt Drive has been conducted in consideration of traffic calming measures as per the <u>Traffic Calming</u>

<u>Administrative Order</u>. Data collected as part of the assessment included vehicle speed and volume as well as other features of the roadway. As a result, Roosevelt Drive was identified as eligible for traffic calming measures.

Halifax Regional Municipality is committed to road safety for all users. In February 2016 Regional Council approved the <u>Traffic Calming Administrative Order</u> which focuses on making neighborhood streets safer for all users by slowing down traffic. Traffic is calmed by constructing physical measures to encourage safer driving behaviors.

Speed tables (humps) were selected as the appropriate traffic calming measure for Roosevelt Drive (see image below).

Speed tables encourage slower speeds of travel by causing discomfort for drivers travelling at higher speeds. There is no negative effect on cyclists riding at moderate speeds, and there is no effect on resident access or on-street parking. Transit buses can also traverse speed tables with minimal impact. With the construction of speed tables on Roosevelt Drive we expect slower vehicular speeds.

Below is a map of the approximate locations where speed table will be installed along Roosevelt Drive and Churchill Drive. Please note these locations may very slightly during construction to minimize the impacts on driveways and drainage structures.

# **Land Acknowledgement**

The Halifax Regional Municipality is located in Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and traditional lands of the Mi'kmaq people. The municipality acknowledges the Peace and Friendship Treaties signed in this Territory and recognizes that we are all Treaty People.

Halifax is committed to strengthening its relationship with Indigenous communities and honouring the significant contributions of Indigenous peoples. Another way the municipality has demonstrated this is by formalizing the official Land Acknowledgement:

"The Halifax Regional Municipality is located in Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and traditional lands of the Mi'kmaq people. The municipality acknowledges the Peace and Friendship Treaties signed in this Territory and recognizes that we are all Treaty People."

Historically, a Land Acknowledgment is a traditional practice shared amongst Indigenous groups to recognize the Indigenous land and territory they are visiting. Making a respectful Land Acknowledgement now, remains a way to express gratitude and respect to Indigenous peoples for being stewards of the land we live and work on. It is an important step in reconciliation.

In Nova Scotia, we are all Treaty People; with that comes roles and responsibilities.
