NORTH WEST COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The North West Community Council met on March 18th, 2024 where the following items were discussed:

PLANAPP 2023-01145-644 Bedford Highway, Halifax

A public hearing for 644 Bedford Highway was held during the committee meeting for amendments to their development agreement to add two additional units instead of interior parking spaces. A presentation about the development was given by HRM Planning staff and the applicant addressed the Community Council. After the public hearing the North West Community Council voted and approved the application. Six interior parking spaces will be converted into two residential units increasing the number of residential units in the building to 54.

PLANAPP 2023-00912: 15 Sackville Cross Road, Lower Sackville

A public hearing was held during the committee meeting for the recycling depot on Sackville Drive. A presentation about the development was given by HRM Planning staff and the applicant addressed the Community Council. After the public hearing the North West Community Council voted and approved a development agreement to permit an addition to the existing recycling facility at 15 Sackville Cross Road.

APRIL IS SEXUAL ASSUALT AWARENESS MONTH

April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month, bringing awareness to the urgent issues of sexual assault, to the creation of spaces free of sexual and gender-based violence, and to amplify conversations about consent and support for survivors.

Sexual Violence occurs when someone forces or manipulates someone else into any unwanted act of sexual nature either physical or non-physical without their consent. Sexual violence includes but is not limited to sexual assault, sexual harassment, and sexual exploitation.

Sexualized and gender-based violence can happen to anyone, however some women are at a higher-risk because of age, income, ability, race, sexuality and/or gender expression.

Sexualized violence can happen anywhere, including at work, online and in public spaces. It is never okay.

We each have a role to play in creating spaces where everyone feels safe and respected.



HRM TAX BILL DUE APRIL 30

The Halifax Regional Municipality sends out its tax bills to all property owners twice a year. The interim bill was mailed mid-March and is due on Tuesday, April 30. The final bill will be due October 31. If you have any inquiries about your tax bill, please call the HRM Contact Centre at 311 or reach out online by visiting our website.

RESIDENTIAL RENTAL REGISTRY

In June 2023, HRM passed By-law R-400 that required property owners to register their residential rental properties by April 1, 2024.

Only rental properties that are located within HRM need to be registered. The Residential Rental Registry will provide a clearer picture of the rental landscape in the Halifax Regional Municipality. Currently, the accuracy and detail of available building information is limited. A complete record of rental properties is expected to provide significant benefits for residents occupying these buildings by enhancing the municipality's ability to provide services where needed. Over time, the registry will help the municipality proactively identify maintenance issues, reduce complaints and non-compliance, and improve the safety and overall living conditions for renters across the region.

WELCOMING LYCÉE INTERNATIONAL FRANÇAIS DES PROVINCES ATLANTIQUES (LIFPA) DON BOSCO HALIFAX

On March 20, I had the pleasure of hosting the announcement for the opening of the new Lycée International Français des Provinces Atlantiques (LIFPA) Don Bosco Halifax at Halifax Hall.

The new international French school, the first in Atlantic Canada, will open its doors to students in September. The campus will be located in the Bayers Road Centre.



The announcement was held on March 20 which was a special day for the French community of HRM - la Journée Internationale de la Francophonie. La Journée Internationale de la Francophonie is a day to recognize and celebrate both the French language and the contributions that the Francophone communities of Halifax and around the world have made to our culture and heritage.

LUCASVILLE BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION

As part of the municipality's 2024/2025 Capital Plan the Lucasville Bridge will undergo repair and upgrades beginning mid-April 2024. The work is expected to be completed by January 2025.

This work is necessary to ensure the continued use of the bridge and the modernization of some features in alignment with current construction standards.

Traffic will be impacted as a result of the construction. The bridge will not be closed during the period of construction it will require reducing the bridge to one line through construction. Crossing of the bridge will be facilitated through signal lights that will be operating 24 hours-a-day, seven-days a week during the project.

Motorist should expect delays and are asked to take alternative routes whenever possible.



WILDFIRE SEASON STARTED MARCH 15

Wildfire season began on March 15. During wildfire risk season no domestic brush burning or campfires are allowed between the hours of 8 a.m. and 2 p.m.

The provincial website is update daily at 2 p.m. to let resident know whether or not it is safe to burn that day.

SIDEWALKS AND MULTI-USE PATHWAYS IN HUBBARDS AND UPPER TANTALLON

HRM is conducting community engagement sessions on the implementation of sidewalks or multi-use pathways around the community centers of Hubbards and Upper Tantallon. Sidewalks and multi-use pathways (MUPs) provide users a safe place to walk, cycle, roll and access amenities the community has to offer. They contribute to the community's growth and to residents' wellbeing.

The purpose of these public engagements is for staff to:

- Determine support for sidewalks or multi-use pathways around rural community centers;
- Determine community perspectives on the potential addition of an area rate tax to become eligible for sidewalks or multi-use pathways;
- Learn how communities identified in the preliminary area rate boundary for public feedback are using the community centers of Hubbards and Upper Tantallon.

Property owners, business and residents located within preliminary area rate boundaries identified for community feedback in Hubbards area and Upper Tantallon area are invited to participate in one of the following ways:

 Provide feedback by filling out an online survey found on the Shape Your City website. The online survey for Hubbards is now open and feedback can be provided until April 15. The online survey

- for Upper Tantallon opened on March 1, and feedback can be provided until April 21.
- 2. Pick up a paper copy of the survey at one of the in-person engagement sessions or contact Emma Martin, Project Manager to request a paper copy of the survey by calling 902-490-4920 or by emailing martinem@halifax.ca. Return the completed survey to a public library or Halifax recreation centre to be included in the internal mail or send by Canada Post before April 15.

Feedback received from public engagement will be included in a final report for Halifax Regional Council to decide on the implementation of sidewalks or multi-use pathways in rural communities. If supported by communities, and approved by Regional Council, planning and design phases would begin to determine a priority list.

MILL COVE FERRY ANNOUCMENT

On March 4, I attended the funding announcement for the new high-speed ferry that will travel between Mill Cove in Bedford and Downtown Halifax.

This project is a joint partnership between the Federal Government, the Province and the Municipality. The project will include the purchase of two new electric ferries along with the construction of two new net-zero ferry terminals.

This project is expected to be complete in the 2027-2028 fiscal year.





JOINT REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION AGENCY (JRTA) VIRTUAL ENGAGEMENT SESSION

The JRTA is hard at work on the Regional Transportation Plan.

They're working to better connect communities and prepare the transportation system for future growth. The plan will focus on safe and efficient movement of people and goods, and the infrastructure needed to make that possible.
