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DEVELOPMENTS IN DISTRICT 14

Wondering what is being developed in your area? You can go to <u>halifax.ca</u> and type "Active Planning Applications" in the search box to obtain details on specific developments, such as the ones listed below for District 14:

Case 21639- Middle Sackville Master Plan

The municipality initiated a comprehensive secondary planning process for the Middle Sackville Urban Local Growth Centre to enable mixed residential, commercial, institutional and recreational uses on lands surrounding the Highway 101 – Margeson Drive interchange in Middle Sackville.

Case 23293- Beaver Bank Road and Windgate Drive, Beaver Bank

WM Fares Architects, on behalf of property owners, is requesting to enter into a Development Agreement to build an apartment building on lands located near the intersection of Beaver Bank Road and Windgate Drive. This application was denied by the North West Community Council (NWCC) in January, however the land owners have successfully appealed the decision through the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board and NWCC has now been directed to approve the development agreement.

HAZARD, RISK, AND VULNERABILITY ASSESSMENT IN DISTRICT 14

The Halifax Regional Municipality's Emergency Management Division will be conducting Hazard Risk and Vulnerability Assessments (HRVA). These assessments are used as a tool to understand community vulnerabilities, and mitigate emergency risks and hazards. This program will be divided into four phases and will establish profiles and recommendations for action for each municipal district.

If you are interested in contributing to the Hazard Risk and Vulnerability assessment for District 14 you can do so in one of two ways. The first is to participate in the Public Engagement session being held on Wednesday October 11 from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Sackville Heights Community Centre. FLOODING UPDATES

Roadway Infrastructure Repair

The flooding event of July 2023 resulted in 1,600 work orders being generated for staff. Over 20 per cent of these work orders have been completed as of August 25. All municipal roadways have been reopened except for portions of six roads which remain a top priority.

The 1,350 outstanding work orders impact over 400 roads and two bridges with the majority being in Bedford, Sackville, Hammonds Plains, and Fall River. Many of the road work orders pertain to repairing road shoulders. Residents driving and walking on these roads are urged to exercise caution, as many are soft or damaged. Staff will be working through work orders similar to how they deal with snow clearing, with main roads being the priority followed by secondary roads.

I ask that residents continue to report any damage by contacting 311. This helps staff ensure concerns are logged and tracked.

Best efforts will be made to complete repairs prior to the winter to facilitate safe winter operations and maintenance. Repairs are being undertaken while capital projects are ongoing. Increased construction and traffic impacts are expected to accommodate this work. Please consider adding extra time to your route and plan ahead. Thank you for your patience.

Claims with Halifax Water

Residents that wish to submit a claim with Halifax Water about damage can call 902-420-9287 Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. or email customercare@halifaxwater.ca. They will be asked to provide an email address when submitting their information via telephone. Residents should be sure to include their civic address, full name and contact number when submitting via email. A Halifax Water representative will be in touch to confirm their request has been received within 72 business hours.

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Financial Assistance after a Flood

Nova Scotians can now apply for disaster financial assistance related to damage from the severe flooding through the Province of Nova Scotia.

The Province's Disaster Financial Assistance Program is designed to help Nova Scotians, municipalities, small businesses and not-for-profit organizations get back on their feet after a major storm or natural disaster. Not all disasters are covered by private insurance, and this program helps those whose losses are not insurable. Types of losses can include flood damage and damage to uninsurable items like household appliances, such as washers, dryers and furnaces. The program covers up to \$200,000 in uninsurable losses per household, small business or not-for-profit organization.

Residents are asked to continue to assess damage, keep all receipts, take pictures and video and work with their insurance companies. This program will be accepting applications up until October 31, 2023.

PREPARE FOR HURRICANE SEASON

Hurricane season's arrival emphasizes the vital importance of preparedness. Understand the risks, create an emergency plan, safeguard property, stay informed, engage with your community, regularly review your preparations, and have a 72-hour kit on hand to be as prepared as possible.

Securing your property against hurricane damage is also essential. This may include reinforcing windows and doors, clearing gutters and drains, and ensuring that the roof is in good condition. Areas prone to flooding should elevate electrical systems and sealing basement walls can help mitigate water damage.

Monitoring weather updates is vital. Our government agencies provide timely information on storm tracking, severity, and projected paths. Having a battery-operated weather radio on hand will allow you to receive updates even if the power goes out. Sign up for HRM emergency alerts halifax.ca/fire-police/fire/emergency-management/hfxalert, check Halifax.ca frequently, and follow @hfxgov on Twitter for municipal updates and information during a storm.
