HAPPY NATAL DAY!

The Halifax Regional Municipality is inviting residents to participate in the 126th Natal Day celebrations.

As part of the municipality's programming, residents are invited to participate in the Halifax-Dartmouth Natal Day Parade on Monday, August 7. The parade will begin at Novalea Drive in Halifax at 10 a.m. and will conclude at Maple Street in Dartmouth.

In addition to the parade, residents can also participate in the following activities taking place throughout the municipality over the Natal Day weekend:

RIGHT OF WAY MOWING UPDATE

Back in 2007, concerns arose about inconsistent mowing along arterial streets, prompting Regional Council to include certain areas in our municipal mowing contracts. This decision aimed to ensure the upkeep of grass between the curb and sidewalks along these streets, especially since many property owners in those areas were non-residential. Select areas were included in mowing contracts managed by the municipality with an approximate yearly cost of \$50,000. Normally, in accordance with By-Law S-300 Respecting Streets, these areas would be the responsibility of the adjacent property owners.

The 2023/2024 budget has directed a \$50,00 reduction for these mowing contracts, therefore residents are now responsible for the maintenance and mowing of the right of way frontage of their properties and including any grass between the curb and sidewalks along various streets. More information on the decision can be located here.

Maintaining consistency is crucial along our main routes. Remember, By-law S-300 requires all property owners to maintain the grass abutting their property.

While the municipality will still handle maintenance in certain areas, such as those owned by the municipality, center medians, and islands, we urge you to embrace this opportunity to contribute to the beauty and consistency of our city's main routes.

Let's work together to ensure the beauty and upkeep of our community. It's time for property owners to play their part in maintaining our right of way. Together, we can create a cleaner and more vibrant city!



DON'T FORGET YOUR HELEMT!

School has finished up and summer vacation has begun. Halifax Regional Police is reminding everyone to fasten on your helmet before hopping on your bike, strapping on your rollerblades or pushing off on your scooter.

The Nova Scotia Motor Vehicle Act requires a helmet to be worn for all wheeled activities, whether on public or private lands and roads, skate parks or playgrounds.

Wheeled activities include:

- bicycles
- skateboards
- rollerblades/skates
- scooters (both self-propelled and motorized)
- Segways

A proper helmet should:

- Fit comfortably on top of your head and sit low on your forehead, just above the eyebrow.
- Not move if you shake your head.

- Have an outer shell, inner protective liner, chin straps that hold the helmet firmly in place and adjustable sizing pads.
- Meet CPSC, CSA or Snell standards.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT AFTER THE FLOOD

Nova Scotians can now apply for disaster financial assistance related to damage from the severe flooding through the Province of Nova Scotia.

The Province's Disaster Financial Assistance Program is designed to help Nova Scotians, municipalities, small businesses and not-for-profit organizations get back on their feet after a major storm or natural disaster. Not all disasters are covered by private insurance, and this program helps those whose losses are not insurable. Types of losses can include flood damage and damage to uninsurable items like household appliances, such as washers, dryers and furnaces.

The program covers up to \$200,000 in uninsurable losses per household, small business or not-for-profit organization.

Residents are asked to continue to assess damage, keep all receipts, take pictures and video and work with their insurance companies.

We're inviting residents to provide feedback on the Draft Regional Plan, both <u>online</u> and through <u>in-person</u> public engagement events. The public engagement period will run until October 27.

Feedback received will be summarized in a *What We Heard* report and used to refine key regional policy directions.

The Regional Plan sets out a common vision and long-range, region-wide planning policies outlining where, when and how future growth and development should take place. The Regional Plan was adopted in 2006 and is reviewed approximately every five years to ensure it is reflective of the municipality's goals for growth and development.

The Draft Regional Plan is responding to the Halifax region's population growth and need for housing, the need to act on climate and equity, as well as updating policies to reflect Priority Plans.

Residents may submit feedback at any time on the Draft Regional Plan, including any requests for site-specific amendments.
