NATIONAL DAY OF REMEMBRANCE AND ACTION ON VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

The <u>National Day of Remembrance and Action</u> on <u>Violence Against Women</u> is recognized annually on December 6. This day was chosen in memory of the fourteen women who tragically lost their lives in the École Polytechnique massacre on December 6, 1989. This act of violent misogyny led the federal government to formally recognize this day, with a goal to increase awareness around violence against women.

On December 6, honour the 14 women who lost their lives at Polytechnique Montréal by observing a moment of silence at 11 a.m. and wearing a white ribbon if possible.

It is important to remember that violence can affect women from all backgrounds regardless of age, race, sexual orientation, immigration status, ethnicity, education or income.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, police services, shelter and community-based organizations reported an increase in violent acts towards women, girls and gender-diverse people. Communities across Canada and the world began to see a <u>shadow pandemic</u> of increased violence against women. Due to calls for social justice regarding violence against women of colour, and the National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls, there has been an amplified awareness around gender-based violence in recent years.

How can you help?

Preventing and ending gender-based violence is everyone's responsibility. You can be part of the solution when you:

- Listen to and support survivors of gender-based violence. For example, you can learn about the experiences of Black and Indigenous survivors within our region with Avalon Sexual Assault Centre's recorded <u>learning event from</u> <u>2022.</u>
- Speak up when you see harmful behaviour and maintain confidentiality if someone in the workplace has experienced gender-based violence.

If you or a loved one is experiencing violence, speak with someone you trust about getting support.

• Call 911 if you or someone you know is in danger.

EASTERN PASSAGE FOOD SECURITY SOCIETY

As Councillor for District 3, I am pleased to support the new non-profit organization, the Eastern Passage Food Security Society, which will be opening a food pantry and fridge behind the Eastern Passage fire station to combat food insecurity and access by providing free food to anyone in need.

Community fridges are large refrigerators and pantries filled with food that are placed in public spaces for anyone to access. The food pantry and fridge will be open to anyone, and will accept donations of perishable and nonperishable items.

The Eastern Passage Food Security Society hope to make the experience meaningful, creating a space where people can come together sharing resources and supporting each other. The food pantry and fridge will also serve as a community bulletin board for education on community events and resources.

The founders, Samantha Galvin and Patrick Sangster, saw the impact that community fridges were having in other communities and wanted to bring that same sense of community and support to our own neighborhood. I am thrilled to see this initiative in our community and look forward to seeing the positive impact it will have on our neighbors in need. IMPROVEMENTS, AMENDMENTS AND ADVANCEMENTS TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN THE MUNICIPALITY

On November 14th, Regional Council passed a <u>series of motions</u> to amend, improve, and

advance affordable housing in the municipality. A full overview of



the motions and background information can be found in the <u>staff report</u>.

At the November 14th Regional Council Meeting, the motion was advanced that the Administrative Order Number 2020-007-ADM Respecting Incentive or Bonus Zoning Public Benefits and Administrative Order Number 2020-008-ADM Respecting Grants for Affordable Housing both be amended, so that money collected through the Interim Density Bonus Program can be used to fund eligible public benefits, including affordable housing, in the Suburban Area (outside the Regional Centre). This will ensure that the Halifax Regional Municipality can fund affordable housing projects throughout the entire municipality to ultimately support more residents in need.

Staff also recommend expanding eligible partnerships between private businesses and Non-Profit Organizations (NPOs), by allowing eligible NPOs to lease privately owned property or housing and maintain their eligibility for Affordable Housing Grants Program funding. Additionally, on November 14th, in light of <u>Bill</u> <u>329</u> and the Interim Density Bonus Program, staff also recommend that, for the 2023/2024 Grant year, \$200,000 be allocated from the Housing Accelerator Fund to support suburban and rural affordable housing projects.

Finally, at the meeting, the motion was advanced for a review of the Affordable Housing Grant Program to be undertaken before the 2024/25 grant year to ensure the ongoing effectiveness of this program. For more information, read the full <u>staff report.</u>

PARTICIPATE VIRTUALLY IN REGIONAL COUNCIL MEETINGS

We've introduced virtual public participation for in-person meetings held in Council Chamber.

This option is now available for any meetings taking place in Council Chamber where there is an opportunity for the public to speak, including meetings of Budget Committee. This is in addition to a livestream of all meetings, which is available on the municipality's <u>YouTube</u> channel.

In August 2023, Regional Council passed amendments to <u>Administrative Order One –</u> <u>Respecting the Procedures of the Council</u> to enable virtual participation. These amendments provided the necessary legislative changes to accommodate virtual participants.
