#### ROAD CLOSURE – HORNES ROAD BRIDGE

Hornes Road Bridge, between Cow Bay Road and Caldwell Road is now closed until November 2024 to facilitate the rebuilding of the bridge. A signed detour is in place to direct motorists. Halifax Transit will be re-routed and the following stops will be closed:

- Hornes Road at civic 12 (2221)
- Hornes Road at civic 42 (2222)
- Hornes Road at civic 74 (2223)
- Hornes Road after Cow Bay Road (7147)
- Caldwell Road after Hornes Road (8663)
- Hornes road after Scott Drive (8662)
- Hornes Road at civic 41 (8661)
- Hornes Road at civic 65 (8660)

#### WORK ON CALDWELL ROAD

The municipality is replacing the surface layer of asphalt on Caldwell Road, from Cow Bay Road to Shore Road, and replacing the existing curb and sidewalk along the western side of Caldwell Road, from Cow Bay Road to the Oceanview Continuing Care Centre. In addition to this work, eight sets of speed cushions will be installed along Caldwell Road. #### OUTDOOR POOLS AND BEACHES OPEN FOR 2024 SEASON

The Halifax Regional Municipality is advising residents that the Bedford and Cole Harbour outdoor pools, as well as all supervised municipal beaches, are now open for the season.

The new Halifax Commons Aquatics Facility <u>opened</u> on Saturday, June 15, and the pool schedule can be found <u>here</u>.

Swim passes can be purchased <u>online</u> for both the Bedford and Cole Harbour outdoor pools. Memberships for the Bedford Outdoor Pool can also be purchased in-person at the LeBrun Recreation Centre. Memberships for the Cole Harbour Outdoor Pool can be purchased inperson at the Cole Harbour Recreation Centre.

The Bayers-Westwood, Cole Harbour, Halifax Common, George Dixon, Isleville Street, Sackville, and Westmount and Shirley's splashpads opened for the 2024 season on Friday, June 14.

The municipality has begun testing water quality for bacteria levels and monitoring for blue-green algae at all municipally supervised beaches. Testing will continue until Saturday, August 31.

#### FREE ELECTRIC VEHICLE TEST **DRIVE EVENT**

The Halifax Regional Municipality has partnered with Next Ride and the Clean Foundation to offer a number of free electric vehicle (EV) test drive events to residents across the municipality, including in rural, urban and suburban areas. These events will take place from June to August.

During each test drive event, residents can expect a free test drive in an electric vehicle, information on electric vehicles, electric vehicle rebates, and the Municipal Electric Vehicle Strategy.

Many of the events will take place next to the locations of the municipality's EV chargers - a project currently underway to install public EV chargers across the region. Both the EV test drive events and EV charger installation are in support of the Municipal Electric Vehicle Strategy and efforts to support the decarbonization of transportation.
