MARCH IS FRANCOPHONIE MONTH

March is Francophonie Month, celebrating the French language and diverse Francophone cultures through cultural activities held worldwide.

March 20 has been observed worldwide as International Francophonie Day since 1988. The date commemorates the establishment of the Agence de Coopération Culturelle et Technique, the precursor to the <u>International Organization</u> of La Francophonie, the organization representing countries and regions where French is the first or customary language. Today, with 300 million speakers worldwide, French is the fifth most spoken language in the world; La Francophonie has 88 member states and governments.

Update on 78 Sherwood Drive:

Public input via the Housing Accelerator Fund email closed as of February 16, 2024. The Sherwood location is one of many development proposals that will make up this report, along with proposed amendments to the HRM planning strategy. Staff will be taking all the comments and concerns into consideration for recommendations to Regional Council. We are expecting this report to come to Council in March or April of this year.

New Development Application for 1226 Cole Harbour Road and 77 Bissett Road:

There has been a Development Application for a long-term care facility and four apartment buildings for this location.

Caldwell Road – Phase 2:

March 2024

There has been a delay in the construction of the second phase of the Caldwell Road recapitalization project. HRM is waiting on NS Power for the relocation of the power poles. There have been some unforeseen challenges unfortunately. The new date for Caldwell Road phase 2 completion has been pushed out to 2025.

The municipality's 2024/25 Budget and

Business Planning process has now started and will continue until next month. Over the winter, municipal business units presented plans to Regional Council with their intentions for the upcoming fiscal year and outlining the required budgets to achieve their goals. During this process, Regional Council asked questions, discussed, debated, and considered each department's proposed priorities and budget. This can result in revisions to budget plans along the way.

The 2024/25 Budget and Business Plan approval date is scheduled for April 23, 2024, where Regional Council will finalize what next year's budget.
