In 2021, Nova Scotia officially designated August 1 as [Emancipation Day](#), a time to reflect and acknowledge our shared history of the

enslavement of people of African descent in Canada.

On August 1, 1834, the [Slavery Abolition Act of 1833](#) became law, officially ending the practice of slavery across the British Empire.

Slavery was foundational in the systemic anti-Black racism that impacts people of African descent today. Recognizing Emancipation Day provides an opportunity to maintain ongoing meaningful dialogue around race relations and inclusion, and to celebrate the diverse heritage, culture and contributions of people of African descent across the region.

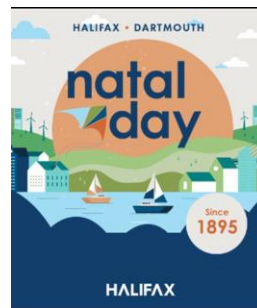

ZERO EMISSION BUS POP UPS



The [Zero Emission Bus Project](#) is the first of its kind in Atlantic Canada. The project will result in the addition of more than 200 electric buses to the Halifax Transit fleet, an expansion of the Ragged Lake Transit Centre, and an eco-rebuild of the Burnside Transit Centre to achieve a net-zero ready standard.

The Zero Emission Bus Project aligns with municipal, provincial and federal climate targets and will help to achieve the goals and actions outlined in HalifACT, the municipality's climate action plan.

Open until August 12, [the survey](#) is used to measure residents' perception of our existing transportation network (walking/ rolling, bicycling, transit and driving). It helps the municipality learn more about how and why residents travel, as well as understand what motivates people to use sustainable transportation modes.

This year's [survey](#) will help set the future framework for sustainable transportation in the Halifax region as the most recent survey was completed in 2019 and the way many people travel each day has changed significantly since the pandemic.

The [Traveller Opinion Survey](#) stems from the municipality's [Integrated Mobility Plan](#) (IMP). Endorsed by Regional Council in 2017, the IMP creates a vision for moving people and goods around the Halifax region and seeks to improve the links between residents and their communities.

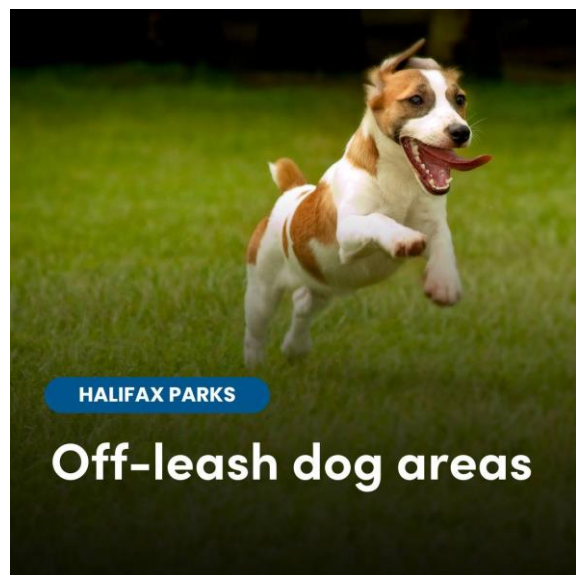

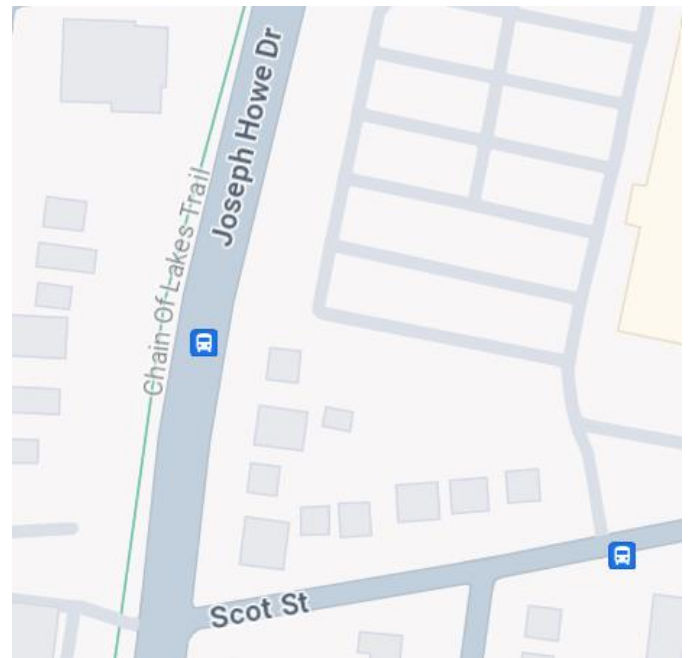


On August 26, Halifax Transit will introduce the realignment of the Route 26 Springvale afternoon schedule to better align with St. Agnes Junior High School times.

PREVENT THE SPREAD OF INVASIVE SPECIES



Hemlock Woolly Adelgid

New invasive species are increasingly being detected in the Halifax region. These are species introduced from elsewhere that can have detrimental impacts on local ecosystems. This summer the municipality is focused on addressing invasions of [of hemlock woolly adelgid \(HWA\)](#) and [yellow floating heart \(YFH\)](#). Both species are at a stage in their local introductions where they can be reasonably managed/contained, making them a high priority for treatment.

The municipality is conducting public engagement throughout the summer of 2024 to inform the development of future invasive species treatment and management plans.

Environment and Climate Change team members will be visiting parks on sunny summer evenings throughout August. Look out for our information tables!

Yellow Floating Heart Engagement



Invasive yellow floating heart has taken over most of the surface of Little Albro Lake in Dartmouth. In 2024, yellow floating heart spread to Albro Lake, which is directly upstream. This free event will be held in two parts. The first will be a nature walk from Little Albro Lake to Albro Lake featuring discussion about the spread and impact of aquatic invasive species. The second will be a community engagement session to discuss yellow floating heart management in Albro Lake (manual removal) and Little Albro Lake (selective herbicide application), and strategies people can use to prevent accidental spread of invasive species.

August 22 (6:30PM ~ 9PM)

Screening of *In the Quiet and the Dark* with an expert panel discussion featuring Donna Crossland at the Fairbanks Centre in Shubie Park.

This event will include an opportunity to complete the public engagement survey and weigh in on treatment methods and priority places for HWA.
