LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Transportation Standing Committee Terms of Reference, section 7(b) which states: "The Transportation Standing Committee shall promote and encourage the Municipality's Active Transportation corridor initiatives which supports the overall Transportation Strategy as outlined in the Regional Plan".

RECOMMENDATION

The Transportation Standing Committee recommends that Halifax Regional Council:

- 1. Request a staff report on adding a new corridor connecting candidate Local Street Bikeway routes Charles Street to Allan/Oak Street, as presented at the September 15, 2016 meeting of the Active Transportation Advisory Committee to the Active Transportation Priorities Plan and;
- That the requested staff report also include the addition of any and all Active Transportation candidate routes identified in the Cole Harbour Basin Open Space Plan to the Active Transportation Priorities Plan.

BACKGROUND

A report from the Active Transportation Standing Committee dated September 22, 2016 pertaining to the addition of a new corridor connecting candidate Local Street Bikeway routes Charles Street to Allan/Oak Street was before the Transportation Standing Committee for consideration at its meeting held on June 7, 2017.

SUBJECT: Willow Street Local Street Bikeway

ORIGIN

Motion passed by the Active Transportation Advisory Committee at a meeting held on September 15, 2016.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Mandate of the Active Transportation Advisory Committee – 'To advise the Transportation Standing Committee on all matters relating to active transportation in Halifax Regional Municipality, using the Active Transportation Plan as a guide.

RECOMMENDATION

The Active Transportation Advisory Committee recommends the Transportation Standing Committee request a staff report on adding a new corridor connecting candidate Local Street Bikeway routes Charles Street to Allan/Oak Street to the Active Transportation Priorities, as presented at the September 15, 2016 meeting of the Active Transportation Advisory Committee.

BACKGROUND

At the September 15, 2016 meeting of the Active Transportation Advisory Committee the Committee discussed a proposal for a new Local Street Bikeway. The new corridor would start at Charles Street, head north on Clifton, Street, west on Willow Street and south on Harvard Street, ending at the four-way stop at Allan and Oak Streets; and a greenway would be built connecting Willow to Harvard (at Chebucto) through the Oxford Street School property.

DISCUSSION

The Committee discussed the bikeway corridor and was supportive of the proposal based on the following factors:

- The route would fill a missing link between the Agricola Street retail area and the Quinpool Road District.
- All of the streets are local in nature and have low traffic volumes.
- Anecdotal observation indicates that parts of this route are already used commonly by people bicycling
- It would provide an alternative route for less experienced riders and families who would want to avoid North Street and parts of Windsor Street, particularly the Windsor/Chebucto/Cunard intersection.
- There are marked crosswalks at Agricola, Robie, Windsor, and Chebucto and there are no traffic lights along the route.
- The small greenway required to connect Willow Street and Harvard Street would be short and easy to build and it would run behind Oxford Street School on an underused portion of the property and this would provide safe access for children biking to school from the south and east.

The Committee passed a motion recommending that the Transportation Standing Committee request a staff report on the proposal.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Financial implications have not been identified. Any financial implications associated with this request would have to be identified in a future staff report.

RISK CONSIDERATION

Risk considerations have not been identified. Any risk considerations associated with this request would have to be identified in a future staff report.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The Active Transportation Committee is comprised of four members at large, one representative from the following organizations: Halifax Regional Trails Association, Halifax Cycling Coalition, Province of Nova Scotia, Bicycle Nova Scotia, Ecology Action Centre, Advisory Committee on Accessibility in HRM; and three Councillors.
