14.1 CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER 14.1.1 Award – Province of Nova Scotia Request for Proposal (RFP) WS49662970 for Heating Fuel/Propane/Jet Fuel/Diesel/Gasoline

Regional Council deferred the recommendation to the September 19, 2017 meeting, pending an information report.

## 14.1.2 Administrative Order 50 Disposal of Surplus Real Property – PID 40107153, Lot 3 Shore Drive, Bedford

Regional Council approved the following motion:

That Halifax Regional Council schedule a public hearing to consider the sale of PID 40107153 - Lot 3 Shore Drive, Bedford, to the Bedford Basin Yacht Club as per the terms and conditions of sale set out in Table 2 of the staff report dated July 7, 2017. The public hearing has been scheduled for October 3, 2017.

#### 14.1.3 Lease - North Preston Recreation Field - 857 Upper Governor Street

Regional Council approved the following motion:

That Halifax Regional Council enter into a twenty (20) year lease with Halifax Regional Water Commission for a recreation field located at 857 Upper Governor Street.

#### 14.1.4 Community Integration Fund – Otter Lake Landfill

Regional Council approved the following motion:

That Halifax Regional Council not provide a community integration fund for the Otter Lake Landfill.

### 14.1.5 Proposed Administrative Order 2017-004-ADM, Respecting Spaying and Neutering of Cats Grant Program

Regional Council defeated the staff recommendation to approve the proposed Administrative Order.

Councillor Adams presented the following alternative motion, and in accordance with AO1 59(3) this will be voted upon at the September 19, 2017 Regional Council meeting.

That Halifax Regional Municipality continue the 2016 feral cat TNR pilot project and provide funding for five years, commencing effective April 1, 2017 in order to continue the effective partnerships that have developed between the NS SPCA, the Spay Day HRM Society, and HRM and that any additional funds be subject to annual budget considerations.

### 14.1.6 Second Reading Proposed By-Law C-900, Respecting Charges for Stormwater from Municipal Streets - Stormwater Right-of-Way (ROW) Charge By-Law

Regional Council approved the following motion:

That Halifax Regional Council adopt By-Law C-900, the Charges for Stormwater from Municipal Streets By-law, as set out in the Revised Attachment 1 of the staff report dated July 27, 2017.

That Halifax Regional Council adopt By-Law P-505, the purpose of which is to amend By-Law P-500, Respecting Parking Meters, to allow the use of pay stations and payment options in addition to parking meters and coin-only payments, as set out in Attachment B to the staff report dated June 30, 2017

3. Implementing a process to explore HRM or other public use of the space.

4. In the event no appropriate use can be found proceed with the demolition of the library as approved by Council in March 2013.

THAT Halifax Regional Council award Tender No. 17-226, Montague Road / Serpentine Avenue - Street Recapitalization – East Region, to the lowest bidder meeting specifications, Ocean Contractors Limited for a Total Tender Price of \$1,277,504 (net HST included) with funding from Project Account No. CR000005 – Street Recapitalization, as outlined in the Financial Implications section of the staff report dated August 16, 2017.

17.2 Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM) - Halifax Water Contribution Agreement – Fall River Water Servicing

Regional Council approved the following motion:

That Halifax Regional Council authorize and direct the Chief Administrative Officer to sign an agreement substantially similar as the attached Contribution Agreement (attachment 1 of the staff report dated September 1, 2017) with Halifax Water, allowing HRM to transfer up to \$8,625,000 to Halifax Water to construct the Fall River Water Servicing Project.
