Reason:		
As HRM staff continue to compile documents necessary to appropriately assess the administrative and legislative response to Nova Scotia's largest mass evacuation of people in recent history, it is incumbent upon decision makers to ensure all information is scoured for gaps in process, resources, and legislation to ensure a better and more effective response to emergencies in the future. The Nova Scotia Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy (FOIPOP) Act provides a formal process to obtain access to records under the control of the provincial government. In response to a formal request, documents were released by the province, which contain important information for the municipality to include with HRM's Wildland Urban Interface Preparedness Strategies Report.		
In addition, the Government of Canada's Access to Information and Privacy Act (ATIP) aims to enhance the accountability and transparency of federal institutions to promote an open and democratic society and to enable public debate on the conduct of those institutions. Documents released by the Government of Canada's Access to Information and Privacy Branch include important communications between police, provincial and municipal staff and emergency management leaders on the fire investigation, resources available to emergency personnel, the evacuate process over 16,000 people, and more vital information for HRM staff to assess in making policy decisions to better prepare for the next disaster.		
Outcome Sought: Inclusion and consideration of provincial FOIPOP and federal ATIP reports within HRM's Wildland Urban Interface Preparedness Strategies Report.

Westwood Hills, Tantallon, wildfire update:

- -- the wildfire, estimated to cover 788 hectares, is out of control
- -- crews on scene include 32 from the Department of Natural Resources and Renewables (DNRR), 170 from Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM) and seven from the Department of National Defence
- -- 30 HRM fire trucks, two DNRR helicopters and one water bomber from Newfoundland and Labrador also on scene
- -- winds expected to gust up to 40 km/h throughout today, so fire may spread further south
- -- various structures in the community may be damaged.

This is a rapidly moving fire. People are asked to please remain away from the area.

Barrington Lake, Shelburne County, wildfire update:

- -- the wildfire, covering about 6,270 hectares, is out of control
- -- 40 DNRR staff, more than 40 volunteer firefighters, two DNRR helicopters and one water bomber from Newfoundland and Labrador on scene
- -- some structures have been destroyed and others are threatened, but there are no firm details on the numbers yet.

- -- people should not operate drones over a forest fire; drones can interfere with the suppression effort and pose a danger to aircraft and first responders
- -- people should only call 911 if their health or safety is threatened and they need immediate help; for non-emergencies in HRM related to the police, people can call 902-490-5016



NATURAL RESOURCES/RENEWABLES--Increased Fine for Breaking Burn Ban

To help avoid any new wildfires, the Province is increasing the fine for breaking the provincewide burn ban to \$25,000.

"We need all Nova Scotians to take the wildfire situation as seriously as we are. We are still finding cases of illegal burning, and it has to stop," said Tory Rushton, Minister of Natural Resources and Renewables. "We're taking every measure to prevent new fires from starting. All Nova Scotians need to do their part - follow the burn ban, stay out of the woods and help keep your families and communities safe."

The fine, which is set in the Forest Fire Protection Regulations, had been \$237.50. Penalties are levied through summary offence tickets issued by police, conservation or other law enforcement officers. The burn ban is in place until June 25 or until conditions allow it to be lifted.

The increased fine does not apply to the ban on entering the woods. The fine for violating that ban is \$237.50.

While most provincial and municipal parks remain open, wooded areas are off limits, so provincial parks that are primarily trails are closed. Good afternoon,

I was asked to reach out and provide information on the current fire proclamations made pursuant to the Forests Act. There are police agencies inquiring.

First. I attached the current proclamations in effect, one for a fire ban and the other for travel restrictions.

Our Conservation Officer Service is taking a zero-tolerance approach on violations of these proclamations. We are using the following charge sections under the Forests Act:

Igniting fire in woods or within 1000 ft. of woods when fire proclamation is in effect

Entering woods without 25(1 \$180.0 forest travel permit when travel proclamation is in effect

The Premier just announced a \$25,000 fine for failing to comply with the fire ban. I'm awaiting on the process as I believe the SOT Summary is being amended to reflect.

From the Forests Act

Fire proclamation

24 (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, the Minister may, whenever the Minister deems it necessary for the protection of woods, by proclamation, prohibit the setting of fires for any purpose in woods or within one thousand feet of woods in any part or parts of the Province during the period specified in the proclamation.

(2) Where a proclamation is made pursuant to subsection (1), no person shall ignite or cause to be ignited a fire in the

woods or within one thousand feet of woods in a part or parts of the Province during the period specified in the proclamation.

- (3) Notice of any proclamation issued pursuant to this Act shall be given in such manner as the Minister deems will give the most prompt and adequate publicity.
- (4) A copy of any newspaper containing the proclamation shall be evidence in court of the publication and the content of the proclamation without further proof of the matter. R.S., c. 179, s. 24.

Restricted travel zone

- 25 (1) Whenever deemed necessary for the protection of the woods, the Minister may at any time by proclamation set aside for any period of time a restricted travel zone in any area of woods upon which no person shall enter for the purpose of travelling, camping, fishing or picnicking, or any other purpose, without a travel permit.
- (2) A travel permit may be issued by the Minister, a conservation officer or other person authorized by the Minister.
- (3) Subsections (1) and (2) do not apply to the owner or occupier of woods or the servants, agents or assigns thereof, conservation officers, surveyors and any other person designated from time to time by order of the Minister.
- (4) A forest travel permit may be cancelled or suspended at any time by the Minister, a conservation officer or other person authorized by the Minister. R.S., c. 179, s. 25.

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FIRE PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS Section 25(1) of the Forests Act, R.S.N.S. 1989, c. 179, authorizes the Minister of the Department of Natural Resources and Renewables, whenever the Minister deems it necessary for the protection of the woods, to designate by Proclamation a restricted travel zone in any area of woods upon which no person shall enter for the purpose of travelling, camping, fishing or picnicking, or any other purpose, without a valid travel permit issued by the Minister, a conservation officer or other person authorized by the Minister, during the period specified in the Proclamation;

AND WHEREAS the Minister of Natural Resources and Renewables now deems it necessary for the protection of the woods to make such a Proclamation;

NOW KNOW that the Minister of Natural Resources and Renewables, pursuant to Section 25(1) of the *Forests Act*, does hereby prohibit entry into the woods for the purposes of travelling, camping, fishing or picnicking, or any other purpose, without a valid travel permit in all counties in Nova Scotia;

THIS PROCLAMATION shall be effective at 4:00PM on May 30, 2023, and ending at 2:00 PM on June 25, 2023, unless and until this Proclamation is revoked by further notice.

ANY PERSON who contravenes this Proclamation may be liable to prosecution by virtue of the provisions of the *Forests Act*.

FIRE PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS subsection 24(1) of the *Forests Act*, R.S.N.S. 1989, c. 179, authorizes the Minister of the Department of Natural Resources and Renewables, whenever the Minister deems it necessary for the protection of the woods to, by proclamation, prohibit the setting of fires for any purpose in woods or within one thousand feet of woods in all counties in Nova Scotia during the period specified in the proclamation;

AND WHEREAS the *Forests Act* defines "woods" as forest land and rock barren, brush land, dry marsh, bog and muskeg, and "forest land" as land bearing forest growth or land from which the forest has been removed but which shows surface evidence of past forest occupation and is not now in other use;

AND WHEREAS the Minister of Natural Resources and Renewables now deems it necessary for the protection of the woods to make such a proclamation;

NOW THEREFORE the Minister of Natural Resources and Renewables, under subsection 24(1) of the *Forests Act*, prohibits the setting of fires for any purposes in woods or within one thousand feet of woods in all counties in Nova Scotia, during a period to commence at 10:00 AM on May 29, 2023 and ending at 2:00 PM on June 25, 2023, unless and until:

- (a) the Minister announces a particular day to be a burn day or a restricted burn day as set out under Section 5 of the Forest Fire Protection Regulations; or
- (b) this Proclamation is revoked by further notice.

ANY PERSON who contravenes this proclamation shall be liable to prosecution under the Forests Act.

I was asked to reach out and provide information on the current fire proclamations made pursuant to the Forests Act. There are police agencies inquiring.

First. I attached the current proclamations in effect, one for a fire ban and the other for travel restrictions.

Our Conservation Officer Service is taking a zero-tolerance approach on violations of these proclamations. We are using the following charge sections under the Forests Act:

To help avoid any new wildfires, the Province is increasing the fine for breaking the provincewide burn ban to \$25,000.

"We need all Nova Scotians to take the wildfire situation as seriously as we are. We are still finding cases of illegal burning, and it has to stop," said Tory Rushton, Minister of Natural Resources and Renewables. "We're taking every measure to prevent new fires from starting. All Nova Scotians need to do their part - follow the burn ban, stay out of the woods and help keep your families and communities safe."

The fine, which is set in the Forest Fire Protection Regulations, had been \$237.50. Penalties are levied through summary offence tickets issued by police, conservation or other law enforcement officers. The burn ban is in place until June 25 or until conditions allow it to be lifted.

The increased fine does not apply to the ban on entering the woods. The fine for violating that ban is \$237.50.

While most provincial and municipal parks remain open, wooded areas are off limits, so provincial parks that are primarily trails are closed. 



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

Regarding Full Opening of all Fire Zones:

 Starting tomorrow morning at 9:00 am EMO/Municipality Groups want to allow only residents who have lost property into the evac zones

- These residents will be contacted today and advised that at 9:00 am tomorrow they will be allowed to access the restricted zones to go to their properties
- At 12 noon or thereabouts, all restricted areas will be opened to everyone else
- Again, it is imperative that TIR and private companies hold all access points while this is occurring

Reporter's questions: This Sunday I'm hosting CBC Radio's call-in show Maritime Connection. On the show we're asking: "Is it time to rethink the regulations and culture around burning in the maritimes." I'm hoping for 2 things from DNR if possible.

- 1) The latest information on the status of the investigation into the cause of the recent wildfires in Nova Scotia particularly the Barrington Lake fire and the Tantallon/Hammonds plains fire. If the investigation is still with DNR and not handed over to the RCMP, that's fine of course. I just need the most up to date info so I've got the right context for the show. Also, can people be held liable for the cost of firefighting efforts? Would that be a charge given by the RCMP/law enforcement, or DNRR?
- 2) I would like to interview someone from DNR about what goes into the decision around burning regulations. What factors are at play when it's decided to turn a particular area on the burn map from green to yellow etc. I'd also like to talk about best practices when it comes to people burning brush on their property. For instance, if the map is green but it's windy, should someone think twice about setting a fire?

Ideally this interview can be done live on the air at around 4pm this Sunday. I'm sure many people will have questions and it would be great if my guest could answer some of them. If that's not possible, I'm open to making other arrangements.

Strategy: interview with Scott Tingley or Jim Rudderham

The daily burn ban restrictions are determined based on 31 scientific grade weather stations, which have been strategically placed across the province to represent forest conditions. Each weather station site adheres to the standards described by the weather guide for the Canadian Forest

Fire Danger Rating System (CFFDRS) – a national system for rating the risk of forest fire in Canada. One part of the CFFDRS is the Canadian Fire Weather Index System or more commonly known as the FWI system. The system uses temperature, relative humidity (RH), wind speed, and 24-hour rainfall to describe the first three components of the FWI system which are the fuel moisture codes and provides for informed decision making when it comes to the Burn Safe map. We also factor in current wildfire activity and demand on our firefighting resources when applicable. Although the final product is a map which sets the restrictions by county, we look at all weather stations within a surrounding county to produce the FWI system codes and indices to make informed decisions. We needed to take the time to monitor for hotspots, and get to any lingering heat or fires beneath the surface before we could officially declare these fires extinguished. I want to thank all our firefighters who have been working at getting these fires under control and monitoring for hotspots and putting them out over these last several weeks. Reporter's questions: I know I asked about this 10 days ago. But RCMP Cpl Chris Marshall clearly states DNRR is in the driver's seat and the lead on this file. The initial report on the causes and origin of these fires has been submitted to DNRR's conservation officers for more investigation and decision-making re possible charges under the Forests Act. Today's article in Chronicle Herald says that report was dated Aug 24. Do I need to file a FOIPOP to obtain that "causes and origin" Aug 24 report on the Barrington Lake and Tantallon wildfires or is the Department willing to share with the public what you have learned to date about how these 2 fires began? All we know for sure is that it was "human activity". I'm hoping DNRR will agree to send me the "causes and origins" report. I will indicate in any story I write that the investigation is continuing and charges under the Forests Act is still a possibility.

On May 28th, 2023, I, Cst. Ryan INGLES was on duty with the Lower Sackville RCMP. While on duty, the Tantallon RCMP was responding to reports of a spreading fire in the Westwood neighbourhood of Upper Tantallon. Hearing that the fire was quickly spreading, I headed towards Tantallon to assist, with supervisor approval.

Upon arriving on scene, Cst. Chelsea KENNEY, Cst. Scott MURRAY, Cst. Justin LAHAIE, Cst. Jeff REID and myself scrambled to begin evacuating homes in the neighbourhood as the fire quickly enveloped the neighbourhood, taking out forestry and structures.

Throughout the afternoon I continued evacuating houses, running door to door and driving through neighbourhoods, ensuring every home had been evacuated.

As evacuation efforts continued in the Westwood subdivision, the fire jumped and began spreading at the next subdivision over along Hammonds Plains Rd. Evacuations continued throughout the afternoon and into the evening. This consisted of going door to door and ensuring there was no one remaining in residences, as well as directing traffic in a manner to optimize efficiency to clear out the area of potential harm towards lives.

These efforts continued into dusk as the fire continued to spread down Hammonds Plains Road, jumping over to Yankeetown and over the Pockwock and Glen Arbour areas.

The fire extended out to the point of evacuation on Lucasville Rd. between Hammonds Plains Rd. and Old Sackville Rd. I assisted with the evacuation of residents, taking said residents and pets to nearby warming shelters at the Beaver Bank - Kinsac Community Centre and the Canada Games Centre, until I was relieved by night shift members to continue the evacuations at 2345hrs.

On May 29, 2023 I continued with assisting the fire, manning the checkpoint located at Old Sackville Rd. and Lucasville Rd. throughout the morning and parts of the afternoon. This continued again until relieved by nightshift members.

While at this post, I provided escorts to residents in the area to get pets that were left, as well as to get urgent medications. that residents required. This was as per S/Sgt. Geoff SANFORD's direction.

Resident's who attended to obtain personal belongings that were not essential were turned around.

On June 2nd, 2023, I worked at the Winslow St. checkpoint in Hammonds Plains to keep traffic from entering the evacuation zone from 18:30hrs. until 07:15hrs. On June 3rd.

Search and Rescue was on scene with police at the checkpoint until midnight, and I worked the remainder of the shift without assistance. No cars came through my checkpoint through the night that were not directed to do so or did not have access to the evacuation area (all vehicles with the fire department).

On this date, at approximately 1530, dispatch aired a call regarding what was initially thought as a brush fire in Westwood. Cst. Lahaie took the call.

It seemed less than a minute later, dispatch updated that there were now explosions that were heard. Following this update, Cst. Lahaie requested over the radio additional members to attend from Lower Sackville. Shortly after this request, dispatch advised that there were now structure fires being reported. Given the unfolding updates, Cst. Lahaie requested more resources deployed to Westwood.

Cst. Reid and Cst. Kenney were nearby Westwood and attended. Cst. Lahaie was a couple minutes away. Cst. Lahaie directed Cst. Reid to set up a checkpoint at Westwood and Oceanstone and Cst. Kenney at Westwood and Wyndham to assist with traffic flow out of the area/evacuation.

While en-route, Cst. Lahaie noted an immense plume of smoke from the Westwood area. Cst. Lahaie arrived a couple minutes after the dispatched call and met with a firefighter at Westwood and Tattingstone. A short conversation was had about evacuations and Cst. Lahaie aired about evactuating Westwood area.

Cst. Lahaie was aware of the area as this is Cst. Lahaie's detachment zone. Cst. Lahaie was aware there are two exit/
entries into Westwood area; Westwood Blvd and Winslow Drive. At this time, there were only Cst. Lahaie, Cst. Reid and
Cst. Kenney within Westwood therefore Cst. Lahaie set up an evacuation check point at Windbreak Run and Hemlock. Cst.
Lahaie could observed the smoke and fire moving east from Westwood/Tattingstone toward Hemlock and there was an
immediate need to evacuate homes on Hemlock.

There was a large amount of traffic on Hemlock coming to Windbreak Run, which was affecting the evacuation. Cst. Lahaie was directing persons to either leave Windbreak towards Westwood, either to head further towards the dead end of Westwood or attempt to leave via Westwood as it was becoming clear Hemlock was no longer passable.

Once traffic slowed somewhat on Hemlock at Windbreak, Cst. Lahaie ran to several homes on Hemlock to evacuate residents. Cst. Lahaie was at several homes on Hemlock that became completely engulfed as flames were coming from their backyards. Cst. Lahaie yelled inside these homes to evacuate immediately and it became clear there were no residents.

At this time, additional resources were becoming available from Lower Sackville. Cst. Kyle Smith attendend and Cst. Lahaje directed Cst. Smith to set up at Hemlock and Wyndham to assist in traffic and evacuation.

Additional resources became available and Cst. Lahaie was aware that there was a requirement to stop traffic coming into Westwood subdivision. Cst. Lahaie directed members (cannot remember whom) to set up a check point at the bottom end of Westwood, near Hemlock, and another member at Winslow and Hammonds Plains, to stop traffic from coming through there.

While Cst. Lahaie was at Windbreak Run and Hemlock, Cst. Lahaie could observe Cst. Reid at Windbreak/Oceanstone and Westwood. Cst. Reid appeared to be directing persons to leave via Hemlock due to Westwood being engulfed and not passable. At this point, Cst. Lahaie observed that Hemlock was also completely engulfed and thus was directing persons not to evacuate via Hemlock. It became apparent at this time that both Hemlock and Westwood were impassible and persons not already evacuated further up Westwood were advised to stay put until routes become clear and safe to pass.

While at Windbreak and Hemlock, Cst. Lahaie had a clear view of where the fire and smoke were heading. It appeared that the smoke and fire was travelling eastward, towards what Cst. Lahaie believed to be the next subdivision (Carmel Cres/ Hummingbird). Between 1600 and 1630, Cst. Lahaie radioed to dispatch over the air to send an alert to advise residents of that subdivision to possibly evacuate as the fire appeared to be heading in that direction. Cst. Lahaie also aired that Pockwock would likely be in that path as well and also radioed to possibly alert Pockwock residents.

Shortly after 1700, Cst. Lahaie heard dispatch advise that there were now reports of structure fires being reported on Carmel Crescent. It became evident that an evacuation was needed for that subdivision and Cst. Lahaie requested members to attend that location for the evacuation. At around this time, Cst. Lahaie learned that Westwood was now clear enough to continue evacuating the remaining residents. There were no longer any persons or traffic at Windbreak and Hemlock and therefore Cst. Lahaie assisted Cst. Reid at Oceanstone and Westwood to evacuate the remaining persons stuck on Westwood and Oceanstone.

After several minutes, Westwood appeared to have been evacuated and Cst. Lahaie directed resources to assist in the evacuation of the Carmel Crescent subdivision. Cst. Lahaie attempted to leave Westwood, along with other members still in Westwood however Hemlock was still engulfed and not passable. Fire department had numerous fire trucks and hoses blocking Westwood, making Westwood impassible again for members to leave to assist in evacuating. Cst. Lahaie requested several fire personnel to move their hoses so that members could attend other evac zones.

Over the radio, Cst. Lahaie understood that there were additional members already deployed to Hammonds Plains and Northwood/Rockcliffe. Hammonds Plains was becoming an issue with traffic due to the congestion. At some point, a decision was made to make Hammonds Plains towards Tantallon escapable with two lanes of traffic. At this time, Cst. Lahaie noted that there was a checkpoint at Hammonds Plains and Westwood, preventing traffic from going back up towards Hammonds Plains although some civilians were persistent and avoided the road block causing traffic issues on Hammonds Plains.

Cst. Lahaie went back and forth between road blocks on Hammonds Plains assisting whereever. At this time, numerous personel from around the district not already on duty were arriving to Tantallon to offer assistance. Cst. Lahaie met with some of these members and directed them to positions where they could be best utilized given Cst. Lahaie's knowledge of the area and where road blocks were already set up. Cst. Lahaie also facilitated some of these members with PC's to utilize.

After a while, Hammonds Plains became clear of traffic and Cst. Lahaie attended with Cst. Scott Murray (two in a PC) to head towards Glen Arbour to assist in the evacuation of that subdivision. There was a large amount of traffic however, after opening both lanes to be exited, it flowed rather quickly and efficiently.

After several hours of assisting with evacuating Glen Arbour, Cst. Lahaie attended Indigo Shores in Lower Sackville to assist in the evac in that area. Cst. Lahaie remained for approximately 1hr until proper resources were in place to effect the remainder of the evacuation.

Cst. Lahaie returned to the Tantallon detachment and ended shift at approximately 2330 (regular shift ended at 1900).

Cst. KENNEY was dispatched to the fire and made an immediate patrol to Westwood Blvd and started blocking off traffic at Westwood/Wyndham Drive. It was clear that the fire was spreading rapidly and had already engulfed the Juneberry Lane area and the fire had crossed to the East and some homes on Westwood Blvd started to catch fire. At this point more fire trucks were arriving and the fire was starting to spread so police started evacuating all neighbouring streets. Cst. KENNEY was blocking the road

anyone could confirm they evacuated that male. After no replies Cst. KENNEY went up to Ranchwood which was already starting to catch fire.

Cst. KENNEY stated that was not going to happen as the firefighters were already struggling to contain the rapid fire.

Cst. KENNEY went back to Wyndham Drive and got Cst. INGLES to help.

Cst. KENNEY was instructed to start evacuating people on Falcourt as they would become trapped soon because of the fire. While getting halfway on the Wets side of the street, Police had to fall back and continue with the other closer streets. Cst. KENNEY then learned the next subdivision was on fire so Cst. KENNEY drove to Carmel Crescent where the smoke was already too thick to proceed through that loop and the fire was already engulfing homes. Cst. KENNEY and other members were evacuating Carmel Cres, Kata Court, Hummingbird Lane, Haverstock Drive and Shelby Drive until the smoke and fire were too close. There was a significant back up of cars trying to leave the area.

Cst. KENNEY then was tasked with trying to attend the Pockwock area but while driving on Hammonds Plains by Yankeetown the fire was on both sides of the road, and a fireball crossed Cst. KENNEY's path leaving it too unsafe to cross. Cst. KENNEY then helped out at the checkpoint at Hammonds Plains and Northwood to channel traffic back toward Tantallon.

Once Pockwock was confirmed in the danger zone multiple members had to get to the other side by taking the 103/102 highway. Cst. KENNEY, Cst. INGLES, Cst. POWER and Cst. GRAHAM all took the highway and and then started evacuating people from the Pockwock, Glen Arbour, Whit Hills subdivision. Eventually the fire too was spreading toward Mccabe Lake. Cst. KENNEY, Cst. SMITH and Cst. POWER jumped ahead and started evacuating Mccabe Lake Drive until dayshift were advised they could head home just after 2200hrs.

Writer then proceeded to Hemlock Drive in the immediate direction of the wind and likely direction of the fire, where very large flames, extreme heat and dense smoke were encountered. Door knocks were conducted at various addresses along Hemlock Drive and numerous civilians lingering were directed to leave.

Writer then conducted door knocks and evacuations for all homes on Windbreak Run from Westwood Boulevard East, where again a variety of persons were directed to evacuate immediately.

Assistance was then rendered with patrols and traffic direction in the Westwood Boulevard area, during which time several pets were collected and delivered to their owners as well as a mother and her 3 children.

Subsequent fires began to occur in the Carmel Crescent area, at which point writer re-directed there to assist in evacuation efforts.

Door knocks were conducted along the entirety of Sylvania Crescent and any remaining were directed to leave immediately. An elderly female and her son were transported out of the area due to mobility issues.

Writer then assisted in directing traffic in the area of Northwood Road and Hammonds Plains Road, also attempting to respond to requests to assist residents on Yankee Town Road but encountering large walls of flame on both sides of the road and zero visibility due to smoke.

Continued to assist with the evacuation of the Glen Arbour/White Hills/Lucasville areas.

I was off duty and scheduled to work night shift for Tantallon detachment at 1800hrs, and became aware of a fire occurring in the subdivision of Westwood blvd. I departed my residence early and took highway 103 to Hammonds Plains road. I eventually hit a stand still of traffic, where other members were attempting to evacuate Northwood road subdivision. It was complete chaos with a number of civillians trying to drive up the shoulder of the road, or exiting their vehicle and running through the traffic towards the subdivision. I observed Cst. Erika Vekeman attempting to direct traffic, however a number of vehicles were doing the opposite of what she was telling them to do, and thus congesting the traffic trying to exit the subdivision. As this was occuring the smoke crossing hammonds plains road was getting heavier, and ash materiel was landing on my truck. From the speed the smoke was rising to my right, it was obvious that the fire was spreading through the subdivision rapidly, and would likely be hitting hammonds plains road.

Once I got through the traffic and got to the detachment, I geared up and located on duty member Cst. Reid. Myself and Cst. Bousquet got into Cst. Reids vehicle, as there were no other police vehicles available. At this time on the radio, we could hear that the Northwood Subdivision had been burned, and the fire had spread across Hammond's Plains road onto Yankeetown road.

The 3 of us proceeded to do Stillwater Lake subdivision, starting at Brighton Ave, and began going door to door telling people to evacuate, as a change in wind direction could have quickly had the fire consume this area as well. Most people were already prepared and packed to leave, and began texting neighbors. All residents were very receptive to leaving, with the exception of an older male.

The wildfire at this time had spread from Westwood Blvd along the Hammonds Plains road towards Pockwock Road and was growing exponentially by the moment. Cst. Vekeman was in the middle of the road which was smoke infested. Cst. Sanderson was directing traffic coming from Rockcliffe Dr onto Hammonds Plains, While Cst. Vekeman was directing the traffic that was already on Hammonds Plains going towards Hwy 103. Cars were backed up and people were acting very erratic, yelling out the windows, some were crying and honking horns in an attempt to get out of the area faster.

Given the mass amounts of people trying to evacuate traffic was at a stand still as people were also fleeing Westwood Blvd. Cst. The smoke was thickening and at that time it was reported that the Highland Park subdivision was on fire and those residents were being evacuated as soon as anyone could get to them.

After evacuating my residence writer attended Tantallon Detachment to assist in the wildfires (Regular scheduled shift).

Assisted in traffic control movement at the corner of Hammonds Plains and Winslow Dr. Attempted to have two lanes of traffic travel through the intersection to keep a flow as the fire was jumping Hammonds plains Rd and cars were catching on fire.

Smoke was very heavy in areas. Once vehicles moved from HP Road Tantallon side writer attended the Pockwock Rd/Glen Arbour area to assist in evacuation. HRP units assisted in the evacuation.

Again two lanes of traffic redirected out HP road toward Bedford. Numerous vehicles trying to get out of Glen Arbour as fire had come up to Pockwock and was burning in Bonzai St area. GSAR was asked to move to another area as the flames were heading toward the Irving Gas station and it was in danger of catching fire and possibly exploding. Heavy smoke was in the area throughout.

I arrived in this neighbourhood, and observed fire and thick smoke throughout the area. Flames were observed spreading through trees and nearby homes, and smoke at times on some streets too thick to see through. In most of the area I attended, ashes, smoke and sparks/debris were raining down on the area/myself, prompting one resident to ask me if it was "raining". I assisted as directed in the Northwood Dr neighbourhood, checking to ensure homes were evacuated, and advising residents who remained on site they needed to evacuate immediately. Streets which were cleared were radioed to dispatch for advisement.

I continued to check/evacuate people from residences here, and also at Highland Park. I learned by radio that the Hammonds Plains Rd was impassible due to fire, and members were requesting assistance on the opposing side near Pockwock Rd. I drove Code 1, from Hwy 103 and around to the other side of the Hammonds Plains Rd, where I assisted in evacuations throughout the neighbourhoods here. Same smoke/fire conditions existed here as well.

After hours of evacuation, I returned to HRM pumps to fuel my vehicle and then returned to the Haliburton Hills neighbourhood to continue assisting in evacuations here. Power had been lost to most of the area, and homes were individually checked. Most residents appeared to have left on initial emergency order. Smoke remained heavy in the area throughout the entire night. Late into the evening I continued to remain nearby if required and monitor for any remaining residents/new fire locations. Fire was visible in the night sky in the direction of Pockwock/Hammonds Plains.

I continued these duties in the area for the few remaining hours until it spanned the entirety of my 12 hour shift, at which time I was relieved of night duty.

On May 28, 2023 I was working 0600-1800 hours as the Acting Quality Assurance (QA) Sgt. for General Duty Watch 3 in Halifax District based out of the Lower Sackville RCMP Detachment. It was a hot, dry, and windy day. I was at Lower Sackville Detachment at 1529 hours when Cst. Lahaie was dispatched to a fire in the woods in the area of 25 Juneberry Lane in the Westwood Hills Subdivision of Tantallon. The dispatcher advised that the forest fire was spreading quickly and Cst. Lahaie commented that it was very windy in the area. Shortly after the initial dispatch and prior to the first officer arriving on scene dispatch updated that two houses were now on fire. Cst. Reid was the first police unit on scene within a few minutes. Cst. Reid advised that it was a huge out of control fire and that the whole neighbourhood was going up (in flames).

Over the next 15 minutes as additional officers began arriving on scene they took up various points throughout the neighbourhood to assist with traffic control for fire (blocking of roadways) and assisting in evacuating residences in the area of the fire. During this time multiple officers reported that the fire was spreading very quickly; that additional houses were catching fire every few minutes; and that the main entry/exit to the subdivision (Westwood Blvd.) was blocked by the fire leaving only one entry/exit (Winslow Dr.) to the subdivision. I also noted an unusual excitement in the usually calm voices of multiple officers on scene. That's when I realized we had a very serious situation.

At approximately 1543 hours as S/Sgt. Sanford was leaving Sackville Detachment to attend the scene I suggested that given the circumstances, we should consider issuing a Public Serious Incident Alert through EMO. He agreed and tasked me to call the OCC Risk Manager to have one issued. (As per RCMP policy, S/Sgt. Sanford nor myself have authority to issue a Public Serious Incident Alert however the On-Duty OCC Risk Manager does). S/Sgt. Sanford spoke to the onduty line officer A/Insp. Berger on his way to the scene and I called the On-Duty OCC Risk Manager S/Sgt. Corscadden at 1546 hours. I explained to her that I was requesting a Serious Incident Alert be issued to the public warning them of an out of control forest fire in the Westwood Hills Subdivision in Tantallon and that we are requesting that residents evacuate the subdivision via Winslow Drive. I briefly outlined the situation for her, namely that we have a fast-moving forest fire that started on Juneberry Lane; that multiple houses are already on fire with more catching on fire by the minute; that the fire is spreading faster than we can evacuate residences; and that the main entry/exit to the subdivision (Westwood Blvd.) is blocked by the fire and that the only remaining entry/exit to the subdivision is via Winslow Drive. S/Sat, Corscadden told me that she does not believe she has access to the "fire codes" to issue a Serious Incident Alert for a fire, rather she can only issue them for police related incidents. I asked that she reach out to EMO to inquire how we can get a Serious Incident Alert issued for a fire if she can't issue one as one needs to be issued ASAP. S/Sgt. Corscadden told me she would contact EMO and that she would also contact RCMP Strategic Communications Section and have them issue a media/social media release.

(Business Analyst with EMO). I briefly outlined the situation At 1603 hours I received a call from from him. I told him the same thing I had told S/Sgt. He also told me she has past experience with issuing Serious Incident Alerts. At 1610 hours, just prior to hanging up with in order to contact I received email with an attachment titled "NSEMO Alert Ready Request Form." It was an eight-page document (three pages of fillable fields and five pages of instructions.) I had never previously seen this form nor did I feel that I or someone else would have sufficient time given the severity of the incident to read through the 8 pages and complete the form in an appropriate and told him that I would call him back after amount of time. I told her that it is in her hands but I feel that an alert should be sent out ASAP to evacuate the entire subdivision. I gave her my cell phone number and told her to call me if she needs anything else from police.

At 1618 hours after getting off the phone with I called back and told him I just spoke with and that its in her hands and that she should be in touch with the on-scene fire commander shortly who will be providing her with the information she needs to issue a public alert.

I told me he can issue an alert within 5 minutes of receiving the completed NSEMO Alert Ready Request Form.

After getting off the phone with 1 I saw on the RCMP Twitter feed that the RCMP media release I requested was issued at 1603 hours. In speaking with Cpl. Chris Marshall of the RCMP Strategic Communications Section on a later date, I learned that it was he who S/Sgt. Corscadden had contacted to have the media / social media release issued.

At 1713 hours I received the first EMO Public Serious Incident Alert on my phone.

At 1728 hours S/Sgt. Sanford asked me over the radio to contact OCC again and update them about the fire spreading to a second subdivision (Carmel Crescent / Hummingbird Lane subdivision) and to have another alert issued for that subdivision. He was busy with fire evacuations and would not have known at the time the conversations I had with the OCC Risk Manager, EMO, and regarding the issuance of the first alert, nor the trouble I had trying to get an alert issued. I knew that since about 1630 hours Sgt. McCarron (HX03) was standing next to the on-scene fire commander and I knew through my conversation with that she was relying on information from the that on-scene fire commander to issue the Public Serious Incident Alerts. I told S/Sgt. Sanford over the radio that with HRM Fire is in control of the alerts and that she is in contact with the on-scene fire commander who is next to Sgt. McCarron (HX03). He then relayed that information over the radio to Sgt. McCarron so he could tell the fire commander next to him that he might want to have another alert sent out for the second subdivision that was now also on fire.

At 1741 hours members broke off from their duties and began deploying to assist with residential evacuations after my telephone conversation with the Team Lead.

At 1800 hours I briefed oncoming Halifax District Night Watch Commander S/Sgt. Pynn and oncoming QA Aux. Cst. Leger when they arrived at Lower Sackville Detachment for night shift.

At 1812 hours with the fires continuing to rapidly spread out of control and realizing this would be a multiple day event (at minimum) I recommended to Aux. Cst. Leger and S/Sgt. Pynn that having the RCMP Division Emergency Operations Centre (DEOC) activated would be beneficial even if it's only initially to assist us in obtaining more officers, vehicles, radios, and radio batteries as we were already short radios, radio batteries, and vehicles.

At 1900 hours to assist with the immediate need for more police vehicles, radios, and fully-charged radio batteries, I went with three other members to Cole Harbour Detachment to bring all the remaining vehicles, radios, and radio batteries over from Cole Harbour Detachment. We arrived back at Sackville Detachment at 1950 hours.

With night shift members fully deployed and knowing that I had to be back in for day shift the next morning at 0530 hours, I began preparing to head home. Prior to heading home, I had to prepare the urgent court disclosure of an in-custody matter

The lead investigator who was an officer who was assisting with the fire evacuations requested I prepare the court disclosure for the in-custody matter as they were still busy with the fire evacuations. At 2100 hours I began preparing the court disclosure. I completed it at 2200 hours at which time I ended my shift.

On June 1, 2023, being Watch 3 QA, I assigned follow-ups to all of the members who were dispatched to the initial fire file (23-62860 over the first half hour or so) including A/Cpl. Lahaie, Cst. Kenney, Cst. Vekeman, Cst. Ingles, Cst. Murray, Sgt. McCarron, S/Sgt. Sanford, Cst. Meisner (HRP K9), Cst. Maciver, Cst. Smith, Cst. Graham, Cst. Mahar, Cst. Redden, and Cst. MacDonald (HRP K9).

I arrived for night shift and was informed there was a huge wildfire in the Westwood Hills subdivision. Dayshift QA - Cpl. Matt Conn quickly briefed myself and R/Cst. Bridgit Leger (Night shift QA) on the situation and what was required. He advised he had been speaking with OCC Risk Manager Angela Corscadden about possibly standing up DEOC - I then tasked R/Cst. Leger to follow up with the OCC in order to determine the availability of additional equipment (radios/police cars) if needed. I departed Sackville Det to head to Tantallon in order to meet the Dayshift Watch Commander, S/Sgt. Sanford.

I only made it to the intersection of Hammonds Plains and Lucasville Road however when I was met by a long line of traffic which was

headed toward Bedford. HRP member Cst. Charles Bruce and Cst. Chris Kelly were already there directing traffic. Traffic was very slow moving however so I assisted them in clearing it out.

- Traffic was extremely heavy
- As word of the fire got out, some residents tried to return to their residents they were stopped however and turned around.
- Some residents were extremely upset but police not letting them return home.
- Some were resistant not and listening to police direction.
- Residents were advised to call 490-5020 to advise dispatch if they needed someone evacuated.
- It took a couple of hours to get everyone cleared.
- GSAR members also attended to assist.
- HRP assisted with traffic further down the road at the Kingswood intersection this helped keep traffic flowing through the lights.
- Writer advised members in the Pockwock area of addresses to check in order to retrieve people who may not be able to evacuate on their own (ie. Some children were home without their parents, a fellow was asleep in Acadian Fish and Chips upstairs).
- Eventually all the traffic cleared and the road was shut down.
- Smoke became heavier and heavier as the hours progressed.
- Members were redirected to areas to evacuate (i.e Indigo Shores as it was believed the fire had spread there.)

On 2023-05-28 at 1133 hours I was made aware of the Fire in Tantallon and started to make my way over (lights and siren) to assist the situation which was changing by minutes.

I made an immediate patrol down Hammonds Plains (which at time was not under fire but conjested with traffic)

While enroute I noted large plooms of smoke in the air and winds were blowing strong.

I made my way up Westwood Blvd, I made my way to Hemlock and left my vehicle with Fire Command and started to assist in checking homes and having people evacuate the area. Most people were co operative but there was many that had to be yelled at to turn around and evacuate and we (Police and Fire) would be checking homes. While on the Roadway moving traffic, the fire jumped the roadway burning house on both sides. The winds had shifted and thick black smoke was filling the air.

It did not take long that fire advised they had no water pressure and had to pull back due to same.

I jumped in the Watch Commander vehicle with HX01 and then systematically started to evacuate persons from homes that were in the path of the moving fire. Dispatch was advised of each home checked.

After dealing with these homes, I headed to the intersection of Hammonds Plains road and Northwood Road. We started to evacuate the subdivision as the flames had jumped and were numerous homes and touching the road (Hammonds Plains)

The sure amount of traffic was chaos and the smoke at times was so thick that could not see over the other side of the road. I did utilize a mask with cartridges (half mask) but the filters became clogged and getting a breath of air difficult and trying to speak to people was impossible and I switched to a n95 which also difficult. After a while , I could not wear a mask and getting more air by turning back to wind and smoke to get breath. The roadways were blocked with no movement occurred for minutes at a time, we were finally able to have 2 lanes head to Tantallon as roadway to other direction closes as fire across same.

I remained in that area for a while and then made patrols of affected areas to ensure persons were all out safely.

I also assisted in evacuating Glen Arbour area as fire was approaching, smoke was there but not as heavy as previous area.
