## Reason:

Due to a malfunction at the GFL West Hants septage disposal site in June 2024, the facility is no longer accepting out of area septage haulers. Septage businesses across HRM are now required to travel long distances to other private or municipal facilities to dispose of septage raising costs to services and reducing the ability for businesses to serve multiple properties on the same day. The lack of HRM septage disposal sites and decreased number of customers per week is leading to financial instability of septage haulers, causing backup in the entire septage hauling industry, loss of employees in the industry due to loss of work, and threatening industry continuity.

## Outcome Sought:

Staff report to Environment and Sustainability Standing Committee and letters to Halifax Water and the Province of Nova Scotia respectively to address the inadequate septage disposal systems in HRM to meet the municipality's rapid population growth in rural and suburban communities outside the Halifax Water wastewater infrastructure.
