# 10.3.1 Dr. Sue Malloy, Glas Ocean Consulting re: Electric boats/ferries, and renewable storage technology and practices

Dr. Sue Malloy, Glas Ocean Consulting provided a presentation on Electric boats/ferries, and renewable storage technology and practices.

Councillor Outhit thanked Dr. Malloy for the presentation opened the debate with questions from members. In response, the doctor noted the following:

- Halifax Transit's existing ferry fleet can be retrofitted to run fifty percent on electric power.
- There are incentives available from Nova Scotia Power to gain better power rates, if the existing ferry fleet were to be retrofitted to an electric propulsion system.
- The return on investment, with respect to fuel costs would be actualized in three years on a newly designed electric ferry, or within in eleven years for one that has been retrofitted.

# 15.1 Approval of By-law P-505 and Amendment to By-law P-500 Respecting Parking Meters

The following was before the Standing Committee:

THAT the Transportation Standing Committee recommend that Halifax Regional Council adopt By-Law P-505, the purpose of which is to amend By-Law P-500, Respecting Parking Meters, to allow the use of pay stations and payment options in addition to parking meters and coin-only payments, as set out in Attachment B of the staff report dated July 30, 2017.

In response to questions of clarification, Dave McCusker, Manager Strategic Transportation Planning, noted that the By-law P-505 would apply to all public streets and highways.

### 15.2 Implementation of the Macdonald Bridge Bikeway Connectors Project

The following was before the Standing Committee:

A staff recommendation report dated May 17, 2017.

MOVED by Councillor Mason, seconded by Councillor Nicoll

THAT the Transportation Standing Committee recommend that Halifax Regional Council:

- 1. Direct the CAO to proceed with the recommended approaches to implement the Macdonald Bridge Bikeway Connectors project as described in the Discussion section of the staff report dated May 17, 2017, subject to Regional Council approval of annual capital budgets and applicable tender award reports:
- 2. Direct the CAO to invite the Halifax Dartmouth Bridge Commission to develop an agreement that would clarify the roles and responsibilities of implementation of this project, particularly as it pertains to the proposed new structures that would be attached to existing Macdonald Bridge infrastructure;
- 3. Amend the Active Transportation Priorities Plan by designating the following as "candidate routes" Dickson Street, Faulkner Street and Wyse Road between Nantucket Avenue and Thistle Street; and,
- 4. Approve the installation of bike lanes on the following streets: Wyse Road between Nantucket Ave and Albro Lake Road; North Street between Gottingen Street and Agricola Street; Dickson Street, and Faulkner Street between Dickson Street and Wyse Road.

In response to questions of clarification, Dave MacIssac, Active Transportation Supervisor noted the following:

 Staff is currently working an option for Wyse Road which will be more advanced than a typical bike lane given the width of the roadway and what is required for bike lanes under national standards.

- Shore Road is a designated part of the Trans Canada Trail which requires a pedestrian area. This
  area will be evaluated under the local street bikeway implementation process to develop a
  solution for the area.
- The Halifax Harbour Bridge Commission has a representative who sits on the steering committee for the Macdonald Bridge Bikeway Connectors project.

**Kelsey Lane**, of the Halifax Cycling Coalition, spoke in favour of the motion from Councillor Cleary with respect to "dooring". Lane noted support for the Macdonald Bridge Bikeway Connector Project but expressed concerned with delays to the project that have occurred since it was approved in 2015. Lane advised of missed opportunities for funding from other levels of government that have since passed. Lane concluded by encouraging members of the Transportation Standing Committee recommend that Halifax Council move forward on the project.
