
Our Ask of CPED


- 1. Explore support of various types for the conservation designation and fitness area (e.g., federal New Horizons for Seniors Program funding)

We are proposing for Halifax to have...

- The First Conservation Green Burial Site in Canada
 - No embalming, biodegradable shroud/casket, environmental restoration, communal memorialization, optimized land use



And... Halifax could become first Canadian municipality to have ALL municipally owned cemeteries certified as green hybrids

- Fairview Lawn Cemetery, Mount Hermon Cemetery, Camp Hill Cemetery
- Niagara Falls, Waterloo and Hamilton (in development)
- City/Town Councils in Owen Sound and Algonquin Highlands have approved future development of green burials in Municipally owned/ managed cemeteries
- Calgary recently developed a green burial section in Prairie Sky Cemetery
- Mountainview Cemetery in Vancouver does not offer a designated "Green Burial" section -- they have implemented numerous "green" practices into their operations and are considered Green
