Devon Smith and Simone Mutabazi, Representatives of the Ecology Action Center gave a presentation and responded to questions of clarification from the Standing Committee.

11. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Howard Epstein, Halifax spoke about the designated Robie Street transportation corridor planning process and the proposal to expand the street width to four lanes. Epstein expressed support for

maintaining three lanes and maintaining the existing street width while accommodating dedicated transit routes. Epstein proposed considering design options which could include bidirectional traffic signals.

Peggy Cameron, Halifax spoke about the designated Robie Street transportation corridor planning process. Cameron expressed concerns regarding cost increases as well as the scope of subjects considered within the previous staff report.

Susan Bennett, Halifax, spoke about cycling safety and spoke regarding a particular incident involving a motor vehicle driving dangerously. Bennett spoke to the reporting process and lack of appropriate resolutions for incidents involving dangerous driving. Bennett spoke in favour of designing and implementing a bidirectional paved active transportation lane on Terminal Road.
