Patricia Hughes, Manager Planning and Scheduling, provided a presentation on the 2018/19 Fourth Quarter Halifax Transit Key Performance Indicator (KPI) Report, including the annual year end report and together with Mike Spicer, Manager Transit Operations, responded to questions from the Standing Committee.

12.1.2 Amendments to By-law U-100 - Halifax Transit Fare Strategy 2019

Marc Santilli, Manger Technical Services gave an overview of the Halifax Transit Fare Strategy 2019 and the proposed amendments to By-law U-100.

MOVED by Councillor Mason, seconded by Councillor Cleary

THAT the Transportation Standing Committee recommends that Halifax Regional Council:

- 1. Adopt By-law U-105, the purpose of which is to amend Schedule 1 of By-law U-100, the User Charges By-law, establishing changes to the existing fare structure and fares as set out in Attachment C to this report.
- 2. Direct the CAO to begin planning a Student Transit Pass pilot program by meeting with HRCE and CSAP officials to discuss potential partnership opportunities, program details, timelines, logistics, marketing and costs.
- 3. Direct the CAO to prepare a report investigating the feasibility of implementing a fee for access to Halifax Transit Park & Rides.

Discussion ensued with Committee members noting that an enhanced cheaper service should be given only to those with the deepest need rather than being broad based and that more research was required to establish income levels of transit user seniors before considering whether to eliminate the senior fare category.

MOVED by Councillor Mason, seconded by Councillor Cleary

That the motion be amended to add the following to section 1 and to add section 4:

- 1. ...subject to retaining the senior fare category and increasing the senior's fare proportionate to the proposed increases to the general fare, and subject to identification of funding for funding the pilot program for the age at which children ride for free.
- 4. Request a supplementary report that shall include but not be limited to detailed study on income levels of seniors who are regular bus users, cost of a free transit for seniors program, and costs of increasing the fare while adopting an enhanced seniors low income pass program.

The motion before the Standing Committee now reads:

In responding to a question of clarification, Dave Reage, Director, Halifax Transit, noted that it would be a challenge to financially accommodate both a retained senior fare category and a youth free transit program pilot.

Councillor Mason suggested the following further amendment which was considered friendly by the Standing Committee:

That the motion be further amended to change the addition to section 1 and add a section 5:

- 1. subject to retaining the senior fare category and increasing the senior's fare proportionate to the proposed increases to the general fare
- 5. Identify funding for the youth free transit program pilot prior to implementing the pilot.
