Summary

- 20 vehicle/pedestrian/bicycle collisions were reported in January 2019, in Halifax Regional Municipality.
- Of these collisions, 1 involved a bicycle or scooter.
- The remaining 19 incidents were strictly vehicle/pedestrian collisions, with 19 pedestrian victims.



Trends


Vehicle/pedestrian collisions decreased by 7 incidents in January 2019 over the previous month. Incidents this month were the same when compared to January of 2018.

RCMP Halifax District


The number of incidents in January has declined compared to January of 2018. In January of 2018 there were three incidents, and so far this year there have been no incidents reported.


There has been no change in the number of collisions reported in 2019 compared to the same time period in 2018.







14 or 74% of the 19 pedestrian victims experienced either no injury or minor injury in January of 2019.


There have been no pedestrian fatalities thus far in HRM in 2019.

Pedestrian Characteristics


So far in 2018, there have been 10 Male, and 8 Female Victims (pedestrians).

Males accounted for 6 or 60% of drivers involved in vehicle pedestrian collisions in 2019.



Weather & Lighting Conditions

8 or 57% of the reported motor vehicle pedestrian collisions in January 2019 occurred during clear and/or sunny weather conditions.


Only one reported collision took place during overcast or rain and/or foggy conditions.

9 or 64% of the reported collisions took place during daylight.

6 or 42% of the reported collisions took place during daylight with clear and/or sunny weather conditions.
