


Frequently Asked Questions

What do I need to apply for a permit?

- Complete digital plans, showing all structural components.
- Site plan showing the proposed location of the project in relation to any other buildings on the property, the property lines, and watercourses.
- All applicable fees and deposits.
- If the property is serviced by a sanitary sewer system a Lot Grading Permit is required.
- Find more details and get started with your online permit application on Halifax.ca.
- Your permit will be valid for six months.

How much will my permit cost?

The permit fee to install a pool is based on \$5.50 per \$1000.00 of the estimated value of the project with a minimum \$25.00 fee and a Development Permit fee of \$50.00. Depending on the complexity of your project, additional fees may be required. Please consult our fees schedule at www.halifax.ca.

Do I need to call for inspections?

Once your permit is issued, an inspection can be requested within your customer portal of the Online Permit System.

How long will it take to get a permit?

Permit processing times vary based on the volume and complexity of current permit applications.

Do I require a fence if I build a deck around my pool?

If the combined height of your deck and rail exceeds 5' from grade, you do not require a separate enclosure. If there are steps from the deck to the ground, a 5' high self-closing, self-latching gate is required at the top of the stairs.


How can I pay for my permit?

In order for a permit application to be submitted online it must be paid in full using either Visa, MasterCard, Visa Debit, Mastercard Debit or Amex. (Only one tender type is accepted via our online payment system.)

If you do not want to pay online, you can pay for your permit by dropping off a cheque at:

5251 Duke Street, Duke Tower, 3rd Floor, Suite 300, Halifax, NS 8:30 a.m - 12:00 p.m. & 1:00 - 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday. Closed 12-1 p.m. Be sure to include the permit number on the cheque.





Residents locating a pool on their property in Halifax are required to obtain a permit. In obtaining a permit, details of locating the pool, fencing and security (ie: gates and latching devices) must be identified.


Definition

A swimming pool is defined in By-law S-700 as an artificial body of water outside a building, excluding ponds, having more than 100 square feet of surface area that is designed or intended to be used for swimming purposes and contains or is capable of containing a water depth of more than 24 inches.

Therefore the swimming pool by-law applies to all pools which have a diameter of 11 feet or more and are capable of containing water to a depth of 24 inches.


Fences and Enclosures


All swimming pools shall be completely enclosed by a 5 foot high fence that does not have any openings (between rails) that are greater than 4 inches. The fence shall be constructed so that it does not facilitate climbing.

Please note that chain link and privacy lattice have been determined to meet the above requirements.




Automatic Latches and Self-Closing Devices



A variance is permission to adjust requirements (such as lot coverage, size of yard or setbacks) beyond what the Land Use By-law allows. If you are unable to meet a specific requirement of the Land Use By-law, you may apply for a variance.

Permit Fees

Find out what permit fees must be paid when you submit your Permit application.

Apply for a Zoning Confirmation Letter

A zoning confirmation letter may be requested when a property is being sold.

Construction Management Plan

A construction management plan is required with an application for a building permit when the structure is within 5 m of the street property line.
